Where is my Boy To-Night?

How many millions of mothers have asked this question of themselves! What can express the worry and anxiety of the mothers for the surroundings of their children? They fear that temptation will induce their boys to visit the saloons and start them on a downward course. And the fear haunts them continually. Mothers and sisters and aunts have denounced the saloons, they have organized ribbon and temperance clubs, they have pleaded for the abolition of the traffic—and the traffic goes right along, increasing in power and volume, dominating politics and even the churches, in instances. Mothers, stop and think! Men open gilded palaces TO MAKE MONEY. Every gambling den is run to make money. Do you think anybody would open a saloon or a gambling den if there were no gain to be made by it? Is it reasonable to assume that men would go to the expense of fitting up and maintaining these places if there were "nothing in it?" Mothers, stop and think! PROFIT is the source from which all these evils spring, and they will exist as long as profit is possible. If not legally, then illegally. I have talked to many men engaged in these businesses, and have yet to meet the first one who would not rather make the same money in some other business if it were as easily done—and they work as hard as the average seller of any goods. Is it sensible to longer fight these evils, and most liquor men will admit they are evil, with the same weapons that have proven ineffectual, and against which the evil has multiplied? There is one way that will destroy the saloon, or at least the evil of it—and only one way. Had it been adopted years ago, there would have been no saloons to-day, and the habits of drink would have nearly disappeared from society. Its social feature would have been destroyed and its influence in politics would have vanished. Do you want such conditions? Is that what you have been wishing all these years? Is that for which you have made the many exertions and sacrifices of this long and never-ending crusade against the traffic? Mothers, listen! Profit is the CAUSE. Remove the cause and the effect disappears. Listen! Have the government take over the whole traffic. Let it be made and dispensed only by the government. Let the man who hands it out be on a salary, who will hold his position only so long as he obeys the laws governing the sale of the stuff. He will not make any profit. He will not be interested in anybody drinking. His pay will not be greater because more people drink, as it is to-day. His interest will be to obey the rules and hold his position. The place for sale should have no gilded fittings, no chairs, no loafing space. No treating should be permitted, one of the worst sources of the trouble in the evil. Treating is now encouraged because it brings more profit. Do this and there will be no private interests served to defeat proper rules governing its sale, as there is to-day. Drunkards and children can be prevented from getting liquor—they cannot to-day. In such a plain, uninviting place, the social feature of the traffic will disappear, and in a few years the drink habit will disappear. You never can control the traffic so long as it is in private hands and operated for profit. You have tried that for genera-

tions. Mothers, think! This plan will be just to all. It will deny all from engaging in the traffic, and none will try to thwart its operation. They will try to prevent this being done, but as sure as Socialism ever gets the power this thing will be done. It is the Socialist programme. It will solve the problem. In time a generation of youth will grow up who have not been tempted by the gilded saloon and they will be pure of mind and body, and the race will benefit by this change. Are you willing to bring this about? Then help to bring Socialism and it is done.—*Appeal to Reason.*

What is Christian Philosophy.

"I believe that in the adoption of the philosophy of the religion of Jesus Christ as a practical creed for the conduct of business lies the easiest and speediest solution of those industrial difficulties which are exciting the minds of men to-day, and leading many to think that the crisis of government is at hand."—Hon. Carroll D. Wright.

Well, let us agree to this. Will Mr. Wright be willing to adopt the philosophy of Jesus? Would Jesus have owned the coal mines and ground his fellows? Did Jesus preach private property? Did he not denounce the rich? Was not communism the doctrine and fellowship of the disciples? Did they not "have all things common, so that none had need?" Yes, why don't you tell the people what the philosophy of Christ was? How can men be brothers when they have to compete with each other to live? Does any one believe that the Christian ideal is not related to the work of the world? Did Christ mean it when he told the rich young man to give all to the poor and follow him? Or was he joking? And what did he want done, and what did he mean by following him—talking about a future state of existence or of teaching the people social relations here on earth? Does any sane person believe that people who have not learned to live harmoniously can at once be transformed into angels of purity and perfection? Would not one discordant element in heaven destroy heaven? And if heaven is a place of harmony, hell must be the opposite—of inharmony. In this view of the case, what is earth? Is it not inharmony everywhere? Are not the people pulling against each other in everything? Is this not discord, the opposite of harmony? And if this be true, has not the earth been made into a hell by this discord? And what one thing has caused more crime, more misery, more everything bad than private property? Is not private property at the base of every lawsuit, of every theft, of every forgery, of every confidence game, of every crime, in fact? Is that not why the Christ taught the people to abolish private property, and make the earth, and the fullness thereof, common property, so that the interest of all might be the interest of each? Did He not know that harmony, and love, and brotherhood, could not exist between men who had conflicting private interests; that when two people compete with each other in business or in any other thing, that the brother feeling that may have been with them from childhood would gradually disappear, and that hate in some degree would arise between them? Yes, Brother Wright, why don't you make the rich adopt the Christian ideal of common property, common interest? If the Christian ideal is not a thing to live by, what is it?—*Ibid.*
