Sickness Will Disappear.

Under Socialism sickness will disappear. I know you will laugh at this statement. I expect that, because you have not considered what sickness is, or what man would be under natural conditions. Permit me to call your attention to some things which you know, but have not thought about. When smallpox, yellow fever or other diseases become rampant, it is because the sanitary conditions are bad. What is done? Why, the boards of health compel the people to clean up and disinfect, and the scourge disappears. Now, if a little sanitation will, after a disease has a foothold, stop that disease, why should not perfect sanitation prevent it from ever getting a start? And do you not know that disease is the opposite of ease, or natural feeling—that disease is abnormal or unnatural? Now, suppose we have the highest possible sanitary conditions; suppose that all homes and workshops are constructed with the prime aim of being the best possible for the health of the citizens who work therein—do you not know that disease will disappear in proportion as they are in conformity with the natural laws under which human beings should exist? And does it not follow that when the people erect houses and shops for themselves, when they have the capital and skill of the nation at their disposal to do such things, they will erect the best that their knowledge will enable, and that, under such conditions, disease will soon disappear? Do you not know that, if a person lived under right conditions from birth, he would never have consumption or any other unnatural trouble, if born of fairly healthy parents? Socialism will produce the best environments for the human family that its highest knowledge enables it to do. In a few generations disease will disappear. At present disease is on the increase! The present season is impractical.

Since I wrote the above, some one has sent me a copy of the New York Herald, in which Dr. G. F. Shady of that city shows that the sanitation introduced into Cuba has for the first time abolished yellow fever from that island; and says that, with proper sanitation, consumption and other diseases can be eradicated. He advocates the city erecting municipal tenement houses scientifically built as a means to that end, says that it will cost less than the diseases that are bred in the existing filthy tenements now cost.—Wayland.

They Don't Care.

A dispatch to the Chicago Daily News from Vienna, Austria, March 30, states that the Catholic society for the promotion of Catholic schools in Austria, at its annual session, announced that Austria should make war on Italy to vindicate the right of the Holy See. It is this same character of alleged Christians in this country, in the person of bishops that is fighting the Socialistic movement. They will use all their power to help the old parties and the trusts maintain their power over the people of this monopoly-ridden nation. They don't care. They are well fed and well groomed, and they prefer to rule to have the people rule. What if millions are killed in war—they will be only the working people. Think of "Christians" wanting people to kill each other for the love of God! The temporal power of the pope—that is, a government of, by and for the clericals—is what they want. Isn't it about time the Americans were getting onto these chaps?—Appeal.

That is what great private wealth does for its possessors. It ought to make the blood of any citizen of a republic boil—but it seems to soothe them, and they vote the same old tickets for its continuance, while their wives and children live in any old shack and wear any old shoddy. What the rich possess is voted into their hands by the working class. When the working class become class conscious, when they capture the powers of government by and through the Socialistic party, the Mrs. Valentines will either do useful work or starve.—Ibid.
