DESCRIPTION AND PEDIGREE.

Baron Rothschild is a beautiful seal brown, rising 8 years old, stands 15 hands 3 inches high, is possessed of good bone and muscle, sound feet and superior action. He is a natural pacer, and is acknowledged by horsemen to be a perfect type of the trotting and pacing lineage. He has only to be seen to be admired, and breeders will do well to examine him before breeding their mares.

Baron Rothschild was sired by Kean Rothschild; he by Rothschild. Great grandsire, General Kean, record 2.18; he by Mambrino Patchen, by Mambrino Chief, by Mambrino Paymaster, by Mambrino, by imported Messenger. Kean Rothschild's dam by Boney, by Bumble Bee, by St. Lawrence. Boney's dam by Clarion Chief, 2nd dam by Black Hawk, 3rd dam by Tom Kimble; 2nd dam on sire's side a pacing mare by Forshet, by Montreal Telegraph; 3rd dam by Black Hawk Morgan, 4th dam by Long Island. Baron Rothschild's dam, Daisy Bell, is by Mambrino Southam, grand-dam, Lady Rothschild, 3rd Dam by Black Lock, 4th dam by St. Lawrence. Mambrino Southam has a mark of 2.26, private trial 2.20, last half 1.08. He by Mambrino Gift 2.20, he by Mambrino Pilot 2.27 (saddle). Daisy Bell, dam of Baron Rothschild, has a mark of 2.36 private trial. Little Jim, half brother to Baron Rothschild, paced a Port Perry in 1899 in 2.27. It will thus be seen that this horse is closely related to the best strains of trotting and pacing lineage in America. He is a descendant of Pilot, sire of Maud S 2.08, Jay-Eye-See 2.10, Nutwood 2.18, and other noted performers.

TERMS.—To insure a foal, \$20, payable by Feb. 1st, 1904; for the season, \$6, to be paid on the last round. Insured mares must be returned regularly to the horse or they will be charged as season mares. Parties disposing of mares before foaling time will be charged insurance whether mares are in foal or not. All accidents at risk of owners. The offspring shall remain the property of the owner of the horse until paid for. Over 130 acres of good pasture free to mares from a distance.

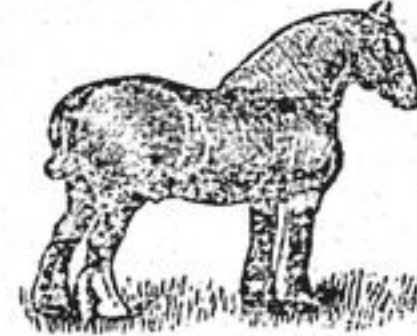
