ACCIDENT.—Last week's *Gazette* gave an account that betell Mr. George H. Littleton's youngest son, and now we have to record an accident that happened a little before noon on Monday to Mr. Littleton himself. While working at the veranda of Mrs. Thos. H. Robson's new house on Fidler's Hill, a loose board in the floor of the scaffold upon which he was standing caused him to lose his footing and fall. The distance to the ground was not more than about ten feet; but he unfortunately fell upon a heap of stones, and his nose was not only broken and one of his hands was badly hurt, but his back was badly hurt. After Dr. Wilson, who was at once sent for, had examined him, he was placed upon a spring mattress and carefully lifted into a spring waggon, in which he was slowly driven to his home south of the river. We are glad to learn that he was not as seriously injured as he appeared to be, and today (Thursday) is able to get out.

A BATH IN THE LOCK.—About 5 o'clock on the afternoon of Friday last, Mr. William D. met with a mishap which—if he had not been a good swimmer and help had not been at hand—would probably have cost him his life. When the steamer *Manita* entered the lower lock he followed it in his skiff, and when the lower pair of gates were shut and the valves in the middle pair were opened, the sudden inrush of water filled the skiff, which immediately sank, and Mr. Davey was left struggling in the "waves." In spite of his exceptional ability as a swimmer, all he could do was to keep his head above water, being unable to reach either the lock gates or the punt tied behind the steamer; but fortunately he was seen from the lock-master's office by Mr. George Hamilton, one of the *Manita's* crew, who promptly closed one of the valves, jumped into the punt and rescued the old gentleman, who in all probability would not have been able to keep himself afloat until the lock had filled and the water become placid. He laughs at the mishap, from which no ill effects have arisen, but admits that he was in considerable danger, as the water was deep and the skiff did not rise until after the turmoil in the lock had subsided.

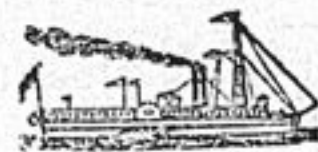

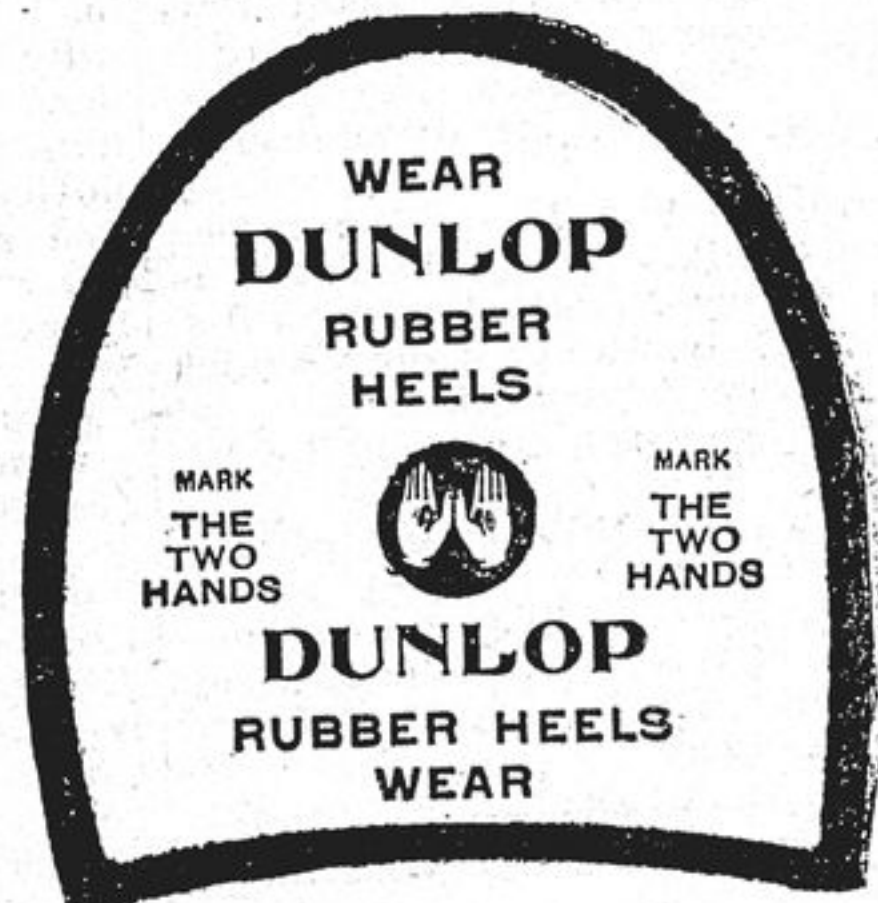
