TOBACCO AT A DISCOUNT.

The tale of British War Office blunders during the late South African war is not yet complete. The latest instance concerns the injudicious purchase of tobacco for the troops. Several thousand packages of black

cake tobacco, a strong variety, were inside without any of the scaffolding the Cape, the idea being that the soldiers might obtain a cheap bacco from the canteens. It was either too strong for the stomachs and nerves of our men or the consignment never left the wharves at Cape Town until the campaign was over. At any rate, some five hundred tons of this tobacco are warehoused at the present time at Southampton docks, England. They were from the holds of the transports Syria and Staffordshire some

time ago. It is difficult to say what the War Office intend to do with the tobacco. As a marketable commodity it has little value. There is not much demand for it in England, and it must be sold at a loss.

A previous stock of returned tobacco was sold from the Southampton Customs at 2d a pound. It probably cost the country double that amount.
