DEAR SIR,
I desire through your paper to draw the attention of the village council to the scarcity of the water supply, and the need of giving it immediate attention. The supply for the village is at best inadequate, but on account of the small rain-fall of last year, the matter is becoming serious. Could not the council at once take steps to ascertain where water could be obtained in sufficient quantity to supply the village; and if need be have the water tested and filtered for use? The supply should be kept within easy reach of the central part of the village. If such steps are taken, those who have a moderate supply in wells or springs on their premises will likely be able to get along, but if the present small supply is overtaxed, and should this weather continue for several weeks, we may pay for our neglect in a way which will not be best for us.
