Brown Bread-When the sponge ready for white bread, take 1 qt. out and add to it i cup molasses. Have two dozen blanched almonds and 4 dozen boiled chestnuts pounded to a mortar; stir into the above mixture, add 1 tablespoon softened butter, 1 teaspoon salt and 1 teaspoon soda dissolved in a little cold water. Mix all well together, add enough whole wheat flour to make the dough quite stiff and finish the same as white bread.

Something Good.-Pick over 2 qts. strawberries, squeeze them through a colander, and add two teacups white sugar. When the sugar is all dissolved, add 3 tablespoons gelatine that has been soaking an hour in 1 a cup tepid water, Place it on ice, stir smooth, and when it begins to set, stir in one pint whipped cream. coffee, tea and cocoa in table linen. Rub, soak and squeeze till the stain disappaers. Fruit stains may be taken out by pouring boiling water through them, or by dipping in boiling milk. If

water is used, it must be actually boiling; if not quite at the boiling point it sets the stain. Mildew can be removed from white linen and cotton with a weak solution of chloride of lime. The fabric

must be well rinsed to remove the lime or it will rot it. Diluted ammonia will remove mildew from woolen goods.

To renew silk, pour a pint of boiling water on a tablespoonful of alcohol and let it stand till just warm then sponge the silk with it.
