NON-STOP RUN FROM LONDON TO PLYMOUTH.

English Railways' Rivalry Time Reduction - Mail Train's Speed.

A new record in railroad travelling has been established by the Creat Western Railroad of Great Britain. On July 1 a regular nonstop daily train service was established between the London terminus at Paddington and Plymouth. The distance is 246 miles, and the "Cornishman Limited Express' is scheduled to over the journey in each direction in 265 minutes without a single stop. This supplies an average speed of 55.69 miles for the journey. This, therefore, constitutes the longest non-stop railroad run in the world.

Meritorious though this run of 246 miles in 265 minutes is, yet, if the necessity arises, the speed can be considerably accelerated. This fact was demonstrated on May 9th last, with the North German Lloyd liner Kronprinz Wilhelm. SOME NOTABLE RUNS.

There is strenuous friendly rivalry at present existing among the various English railroad companies to establish non-stop records. The London and North-western Railroad is contemplating the establishment of a through non-stop service between London and Carlisle, a distance of 2994 miles. They have already made such a run with a "special," which covered the journey in 5 hours and 43 minutes, an average speed of 51 miles per hour. With their latest type of engines, however, this railroad company could considerably increase this speed if desired. On the occasion of the Postal Congress at Glasgow last year, the train containing the delegates, and representing a weight of 450 tons, was hauled over the 4011 miles between the two cities, both on the outward and return journeys, without a stop, in 6 hours and 6 hours 5 minutes respectively, at average speeds of 66.9 miles and 66 miles per hour.


