He wrote: "Mr. Darwin estimates the time required for the denudation of the rocks of the Weald of Kent, or the erosion of space between the ranges of chalk-hills, known as the North and South Downs, at three hundred million of years. It may be possible, perhaps, that the estimate is a hundred times too great, and that the real time elapsed did not exceed three million years; but on the other hand, it is just as likely that the time which actually elapsed since the first commencement of the erosion, till it was nearly as complete as it now is, was really a hundred times greater than his estimate, or thirty thousand millions of years. 86,000,000 YEARS OF LIFE.

Wild Herd had Become a Nuisance to Farmers.



EMPEROR OF JAPAN.

Descended From a Long Line of Imperial Ancestors.

Mutusuhito, Emperor of Japan, who is now forty-three years of age, succeeded his father when he was only fifteen, and under his influence Japan has earned herself a place among the great Powers of the world. His Majesty claims to be the hundred and twenty-first ruler of his line in unbroken descent from Jimmu Tenno, the "Son of Heaven," who founded the dynasty 660 B. C. Two years after his accession the Emperor married Princess Haruko, daughter of Prince Ichijo, a noble of the highest rank. The Empress is childless, and the Crown Prince, the Emperor's eldest son, is the child of a second wife, for, according to Japanese law, inferior wives are allowable. 
