The combs are not injured, and can be returned to the bees to be refilled over and over again, thus saving much valuable time, as comb building is a slow process with the bees, and a pound of wax (of which the combs are made) requires the consumption of 15 to 20 pounds of honey by the bees.

That's one of the reasons extracted honey is cheaper than comb honey.
