Mr. Hughes was found guilty, bound over to keep the peace, and let go on suspended sentence. Our statement was based upon what we heard from two or three persons who were present at the end of the trial.

**AT SANDFORD'S.**—Notwithstanding the immense size of the Sandford factory, it was found, a few weeks ago, that more room was required, and a store room 102 x 24 feet and three stories high was built, and is now being "iron-clad" like the other buildings. There are now between fifty and sixty employees in the factory, which is turning out large numbers of chairs, washing machines, churns, wheel-barrows, step-ladders, doors and window sash, and the manufacture of coffins is soon to be commenced.

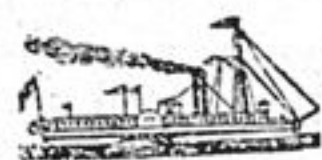
