
SCIENTIFIC TRIUMPH.

The recent discovery of eucaine, a powerful anaesthetic, is looked upon as another scientific triumph. Although it can be used for amputations, it will probably be most useful for treatment of the thyroid glands. In such operations the use of chloroform is often impracticable. Eucaine is injected by a hypodermic needle under the skin at the place where the incision is to be made. After a few moments the skin may be cut without the patient feeling anything. As different and deeper parts are exposed, the drug is dropped at intervals of a few min-
