

MONEY ORDERS.—The attention of our readers is directed to the money order department in the Bank, by means of which small sums can be sent cheaply by mail. These orders are cashed by any Bank, and are found to be a most convenient method of sending small sums of money.

FENCING THE LOT.—The job of fencing the Kawartha hotel lot is under way, and by the time it is finished a good deal of money will have been eaten up. As stated two or three weeks ago, iron pipes are to be used instead of wooden posts, and about a hundred will be required. A good many of them have already been cemented into holes drilled in the rock for their reception, and, of course, will be much more durable than wood. The cement used is from the Raven Lake Co., and one of the men told us that about four barrels of it would be used. There will be seven 3 foot gates, two 4-foot, one 10-foot and one 12-foot, and where a gate is in the fence, the pipes at the sides of it are high enough for a man or a laden wagon to pass under the cross-bar that runs from the top of one to the top of the other. Mr. Elisha Mark has the contract for the fence, and the work of putting the wire on has been begun.
