SHOOTING ACCIDENT AT KIRKFIELD.—A very serious accident, of which Mr. James Laidlaw, of "The Fort," Balsam Lake, was the victim, happened at Kirkfield rifle butts on the afternoon or evening of Friday last. Just as Dr. Ross, of that village, was in the act of firing at the target, Mr. Laidlaw, who was marking, got in the way, and a bullet struck his right arm, which was so badly shattered that amputation was necessary, and was performed at the earliest possible moment. The accident, which is deeply regretted by all who are acquainted with the Laidlaw family, is said to have been caused by some misunderstanding regarding the signals.

PRESBYTERIAN ANNIVERSARY.—The anniversary services and tea in connection with St. Andrew's church were held on Sunday and Monday last, according to announcement. Rev. J. R. Fraser, of Uxbridge, preached excellent sermons morning and evening on Sunday, to large and appreciative congregations. The fowl supper on Monday evening in the basement was of more than ordinary excellence, and the attendance ditto. A programme of music and addresses was afterwards given in the church, at which Rev. Mr. Fraser was the principal speaker. His subject was "Joe Howe, the Nova Scotian Reformer," of whose remarkable life and career a brief sketch was given and proved exceptionally interesting. Rev. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated, or, if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent, receive authority for some one to make entry for him.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.

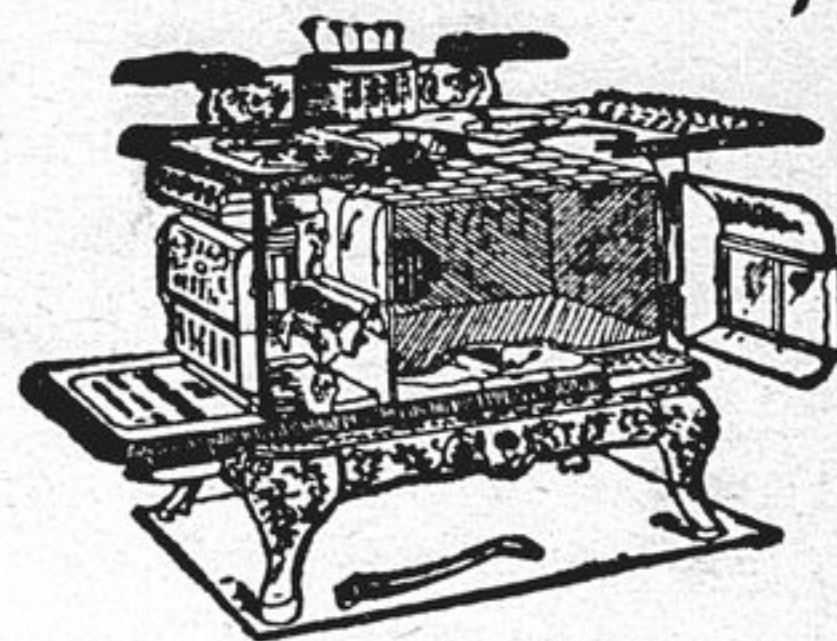
