

WOMEN RAILROADERS.



The number of women employed on the Russian railways is increasing. According to the latest returns there are now working on the 25 Russian State railways no fewer than 22,000 women as gatekeepers, clerks, telegraphers, etc. The average wage varies from 130 to 135 roubles yearly (\$65 to \$70). The exeremes are great. Thus, the women clerks receive on an average from 450 to 460 roubles, or about \$230, while the women attending at the station get only 40 roubles, or about \$19.50 a year, in addition to free lodging and a few extras.


