

COST OF RUSSIA'S POLICE.

Enormous Sums are Spent on Police and Spies.

The "Bourse Gazette" estimates that well over a twentieth of the entire Russian budget is spent on police, and the larger part of this enormous sum-more than \$50,000,000 annually - represents the cost of the political police organization, the gendarmerie and the spy department.

The budget, as published, shows only fifty-four million roubles on account .: f police. This is under the head of the Ministry of the Interior. This ministry, however, has also at its disposal a secret fund, derived from accumulate capital, which never appears in the budget at all, amounting to ten million roubles.

Other ministeries, notably the Ministry of the Court, spend enormous sums on police and spies, apart from the expenditure of the recognized police departments. When allowance is made for the sums expended, perforce, by the towns and the village communes on pelice and spy purposes it is plain that the estimate of the "Bourse Gazette" is well within the mark in saying that more than five per cent. of the Russian budget is spent on police of the kind most favored in Russia-that is, not protectors of the public safety, but spies upon the public in the interests of the "government."

If the expenditure on the necessary cerollary to the police system in Russia-the prison and exile organizations -were taken into account the proportion of the Russian budget devoted to repression would assume a still more fermidable aspect.




