A NEW ROUTE TO THE OLD LAND.

Canadians, and Scottish Canadians in particular, will be interested in the recent announcement of sailings of the Allan Line for the Summer season of 1908 (Glasgow service). The new twin-screw steamers "Grampian" and "Hesperian" will sail alternately with the "Jonian" and "Pretorian," the four steamers providing a weekly service, Montreal to Glasgow, of the highest class.

The "Grampian" and "Hesperian," built by Alex. Stephens & Son, Lint-house, are of 10,000 tons register (14,000 displacement) and have accommodation for 250 first, 300 second and a large number of third-class passengers.

The "Grampian" sailed on her first voyage to the St. Lawrence in October, '07, and has already established a reputation for steadiness and speed. The "Hesperian" will sail on her maiden trip from Glasgow on the 25th of April next.

The great improvement in this service is expected to attract many passengers to the Glasgow Route.

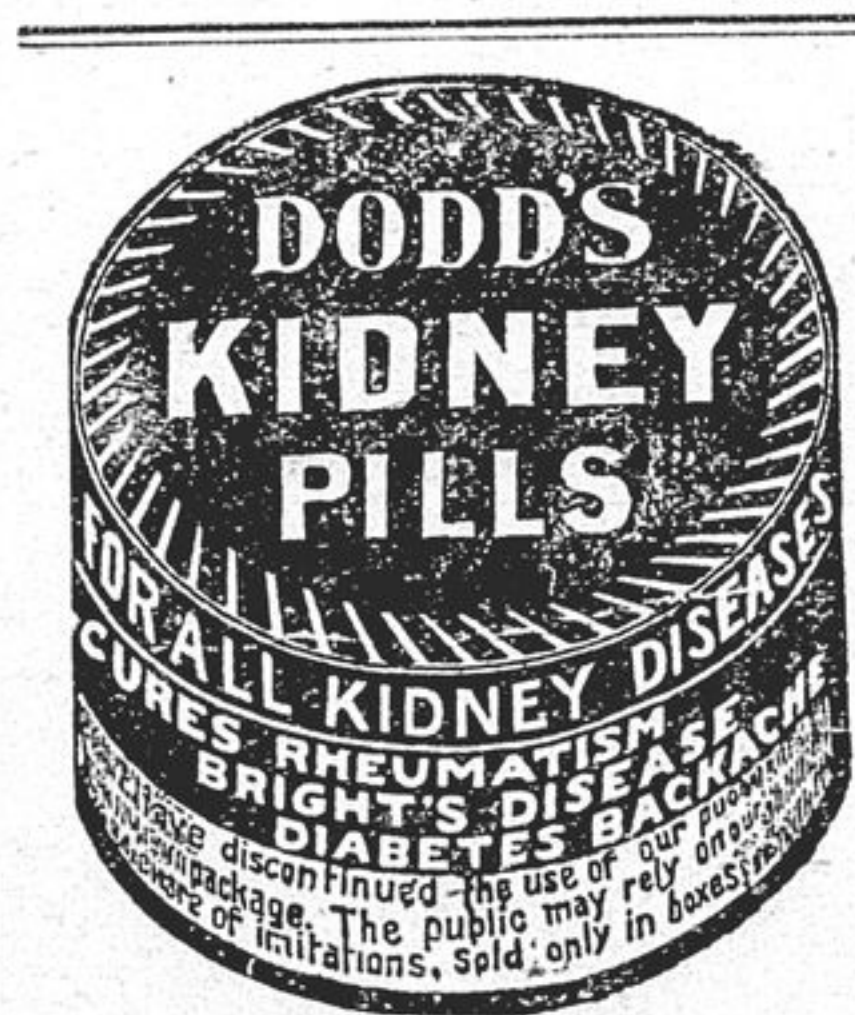
