Telephone Talk.

Mr. Editor,-

In my last letter on this subject I tried to interest the business and professional men of your town in rural telephones, and I hope I will see some fruit from my small endeavors. Two or three hundred dollars invested in our little enterprise would help us out immensely just now. But this time I would like to impress on the country people the fact that they are not giving this thing the support that it deserves. A few weeks ago Mr. Bert Billett, son of Mr. James Billett, of Verulam, had the misfortune to get his leg broken. Mr. Billett immediately telephoned Dr. Wilson, who went out and attended the case, and the doctor told me that he has no doubt that through his being there as soon as he was, (which would not have been possible except for the telephone), two, if not three, trips were saved. The doctor said: "I am satisfied that the telephone saved Mr. Billett ten or fifteen dollars, besides the discomfort of driving after the doctor and the conveniences of taking messages without going out of the house." A farmer who had a telephone heard a noise in the road, and, going to a window, saw a pair of horses tearing along the road, and two frightened and helpless women in the rig. Hhe telephoned to a neighbor further on who he knew had a number of men working; and the result was, when the runaway team got to that neighbor's place, there were a lot of resolute men on the road who captured the horses, and in all probability saved the lives of those two women. Not so long ago as to be forgotten by the neighbors, Mr. James Armstrong's house took fire on a very cold night. He was away from home, and if Mrs. Armstrong had not been a heroine, she and the children might have been burned to death; as it was, she was very severely frozen. If she had had a telephone, she might have had assistance. It is the duty of every person to take all the precautions available to guard | Sheepskins against such disasters.


