The three greatest commercial countries on earth, England, Germany and the United States, are now in the throes of the most severe and sweeping industrial depression ever recorded in history. Factories and shops are closed or their output greatly curtailed, and millions of workmen find themselves in enforced idleness and consequently without means to provide for their sustenance. In England thousands of these unemployed and hungry ones are tramping about the country, and in sheer desperation often resorting to looting and other acts of violence. In Germany conditions are rapidly reaching an equally acute stage; while in the United States fully one fourth of the working force has pratically been idle all of this year. Prompt political action by the working class will make it possible to remove the incubus of capitalist rule without the violence and bloodshed that must otherwise obtain. The present outlook indicates, however, that the prospects are good for a period of turbulence and upheaval more widespread and sweeping that has hitherto been recorded in history.
