

### The North Pole Reached.

Two announcements have been made within a few days that the north pole has at last been reached—in April 1908 by Dr. Frederick Cook, and in April 1909 by Commander Robt. Peary, both citizens of the United States. Dr. Cook's account of his exploits have not been generally accepted as true, but nobody seems to doubt that Commander Peary has actually accomplished the feat of reaching the pole, and details of his achievement are awaited with much interest.

**Lindsay Post:**—The aeroplane fever has struck Lindsay. Riddick Elliott and Bruce Ross, two young men of the town, have built an aeroplane. The machine from head to tail is 25 feet, from tip to tip 21 feet, including the wings. The steering gear is controlled from a seat in the centre, and there is a single plane rudder on the tip of each wing, a box rudder at the front, and a small rudder at the back. The wings at the tip are for turning the machine to the right or the left and the box rudder is for ascending or descending. The machine is made entirely of spruce, reinforced with steel wire, and each joint is encased in a steel shoulder. A trial trip will be made early in the week.

**The Farmers' Sun says:** From eight and one-half acres, R. E. Gunn, of Beaver-ton, this year produced 360 bushels of fall wheat. The wheat was thrashed direct from the field, hauled to the mill from the machine, and sold at one dollar a bushel. "Three teams did the hauling," said Mr. Gunn, "and by dealing with the crop in this way we saved two handlings of the straw and one of the grain. The field on which the wheat was grown was summer fallowed last year, and is well under-drained. "I like" added Mr. Gunn, "to grow a considerable crop of fall wheat every year, wholly irrespective of the price of the grain. It divides up the work of the year, gives you a lot of straw, and by having different varieties of grain, you lessen the risk of loss from failure in one variety. When the wheat is high in price I sell; when it is low I feed it. You cannot lose, no matter how the market is."

**Minden Echo:**—After a brief illness of cancer poisoning the death of Mr. David Galloway took place at his residence, at Miner's Bay, on Wednesday, at the advanced age of 86 years. He was one of the early settlers of Lutterworth, of which township he was reeve during 1884 and 1885. He took great interest in agriculture, and was quite successful at the fall fairs for many miles around. In his garden may be seen a very prolific grape, which he propagated, the fruit of which has attracted attention wherever shown. He was postmaster at Miner's Bay since the opening of a post office at that point; and held the appointment as lockmaster, or caretaker of the government dams at Elliott's Falls. He was predeceased by his wife a few years ago, but afterwards married a daughter of Mr. Wm. Williams, who survives him. Mr. John Galloway, of Miner's Bay, and Mrs. Stephen Otto are a son and daughter.

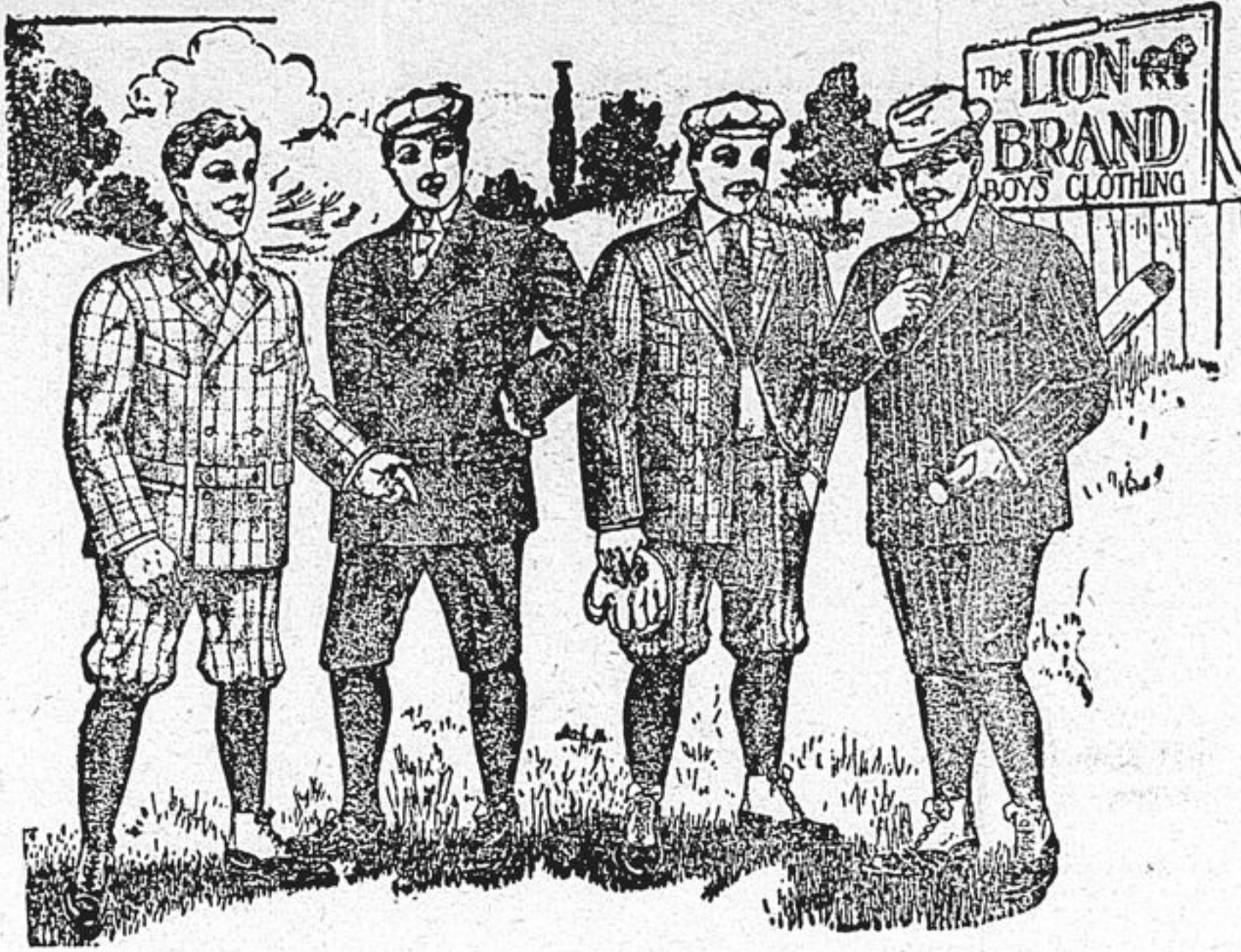
