BY-LAW NO. 581

A By-law to prohibit the sale by retail of spirituous, fermented or other manufactured liquors in the Village of Fenelon Falls.

The Municipal Council of the Village of Fenelon Falls hereby enacts as fol-

1.—That the sale by retail of spirituous, fermented, or other manufactured liquors is and shall be prohibited in - every tavern, inn or other house or place of public entertainment in the said municipality, and the sale thereof, except by wholesale, is and shall be prohibited in every shop or place other than a house of public entertainment in the said municipality.

2.—That the vote of the electors of the said Village of Fenelon Falls will be taken on this by-law by the deputyreturning officers hereinafter named on

Monday, the 3rd Day of January,

One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten, commencing at nine o'clock in the morning and continuing until five o'clock in the afternoon at the undermentioned places:

Polling Sub-Division Number One:-Place of Polling, Twomey's Hall. C. W. Burgoyne, Deputy Returning Officer. C. E. Graham, Poll Clerk.

Polling Sub-Division Number Two:-Place of Polling, Jordan's Hall. W. T. Junkin, Deputy Returning Officer. A. J. Gould, Poll Clerk.

3.-That on the 20th day of December, A. D. 1909, at his office in the Village of Fenelon Falls, at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon, the Reeve shall appoint in writing, signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this by-law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this by-law.
4.—That the Clerk of the said Munici-

Falls shall attend at Twomey's Hall, at the hour of 12.30 o'clock in the afternoon, on the fourth day of January. 1910, to sum up the number of votes given for and against this by-law.

5.—This by-law shall come into force and take effect as from the first day of May next after the final passing thereof.

D. 1909, and that at the hour, day and places therein fixed for taking the votes of the electors the polls will be held.
