A LAND OF HUNTERS.

Germany is a country of nimrods. There are 600,000 sportsmen, which means one gun for every 100 people. 

ICE AS FUEL.

A cake of ice at 32 degrees Fahrenheit is ordinarily considered to be rather a cold substance, but it is as much hotter than liquid air as the oven in which bread is baked is hotter than the ice. A teakettle partly filled with liquid air and placed on a cake of ice receives so much heat from the ice that the liquid air soon boils vigorously, and the boiling can be made more violent by adding a few lumps of ice.
