"The British Grenadiers" at the Canadian National Exhibition this year.

The Healey Falls Syndicate, which has acquired certain rights of the various interests concerned in connection with the power privileges at that place have purchased the interests of the Peterboro Light and Power Company in connection with lighting with electricity and gas. They have also purchased the Auburn dam and power privilege and will very shortly begin improvement and extension operations in the form of a new concrete dam at Auburn. It is reported that a power house will be erected near the Grand Trunk Railway bridge and that a raceway connecting it with the dam will be constructed on the west side of the river. The same syndicate has also purchased the Burleigh Falls Power and the Peterboro Street Railway. It is said to be the intention of this syndicate to erect an electrical transmission line from Healey Falls to Peterboro, and also that several miles of new railway will be built in Peterboro and immediate vicinity this year, and that the syndicate is searching a site for an amusement park to be established in connection with the radial railway the syndicate will operate.—Examiner.
