Count de Lesseps and Miss MacKenzie Married.

Count Jacques de Lesseps, of France, was married to Miss Grace Mackenzie, at St. James' Church, London, England, on Wednesday, Jan. 25th. Most of the prominent members of French, American, Canadian and English society in London attended the wedding. Sir William and Lady MacKenzie were also present.

Sir William MacKenzie was gazetted for knighthood because of his services in developing Canadian railroads, several weeks ago.

Count de Lesseps met with Miss Mackenzie last July when he visited Toronto and took part in the aviation meet there. She attended the international aviation tournament at Belmont Park N. Y., and made several flights with him.

Count de Lesseps was one of the trio to make the Statue of Liberty flight over Brooklyn. He is the son of the builder of Suez Canal, and his father was one of the starters of the Panama Canal.

After a honeymoon in Egypt the Count and Countess will reside in Paris.

The bridesmaids were Miss Ethel Mackenzie, sister of the bride, and Miss Mabel Magher, a first cousin. Mrs. W. W. Beardmore, another sister of the bride, was also in attendance.

MONUMENT TO SHAKESPEARE

The city of Verona is erecting a monument to Shakespeare. The Veronese consider they have an intimate connection with the poet through "The Two Gentlemen of Verona," and because their city is that of "Romeo and Juliet."

Visitors to the city are shown by the guides the Palace of the Capulets and the ruined house of Romeo. There is also, of course, the tomb of Juliet, the genuineness of which visitors are expected to accept. Verona, with Romeo and Juliet, rivals Elsinore with Hamlet in tribute to the imagination—and London is still without the monument to the world's greatest poet.
