At present the mint is turning out the new imperial sovereign, bearing the head of King George. The only distinguishing mark to show that it is made here, is a small "C." The new sovereigns are already in circulation.

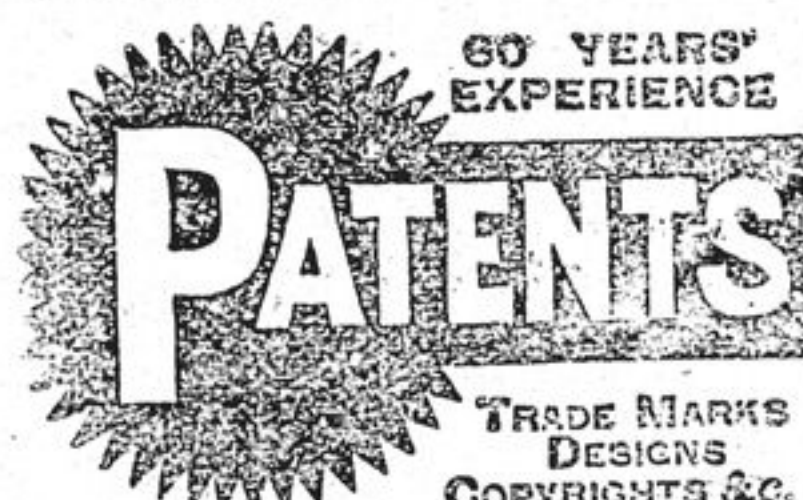
