Serious Accident Near Minden.

Echo: A very serious accident occurred at Peter Eastman's Thursday last, which not only greatly endangered the lives of his two sons, scar and disfigure them for life, but will in all probability impair the sight of Elmer, the younger.

The young men were engaged in blasting large stones in the field, had placed a charge of explosives and were filling the hole with sand to exclude the air, using a broken drill for that purpose. William was sitting on the stone and Elmer had his feet against it. Both were immediately over the charge when it ignited with a report heard two miles away. The stone was blown into a thousand pieces, only one piece remaining in the hole, that upon which Wm. sat. Elmer was thrown back several yards and both suffered severe lacerations of the hands and face from the powder and fine splinters of rock. No bones were broken, and it is considered a miracle that both were alive and able to walk to the house, aided by their father.

Wm. could see a little at first, but soon became quite blind. Elmer saw nothing after the accident and neither of them have seen anything since, although the physician seems quite confident he can save their sight. After the first two treatments they were brought to the village, where they would be convenient to the eye of the doctor, and where they are progressing favorably, cared for by their father and Miss Florence Vincent.

BY-LAW NO. 611

A By-law to prohibit spitting on the sidewalks and other public places.

The Municipal Corporation of the Village of Fenelon Falls enacts as follows:

1. No person shall spit on the public sidewalks or pavements nor in the passage ways, stairways and entrances to buildings used by the public within the Village of Fenelon Falls, nor in rooms, halls, buildings and places to which the public resort, within the said Village of Fenelon Falls.

2. Any person convicted of a breach of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate, a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten dollars, for each offence, exclusive of costs, and in default of payment of the said penalty and costs forthwith, the said penalty and costs, or costs may be levied by distress and sale of goods and chattels of the offender, and in case of there being no distress found, out of which the said penalty can be levied, the convicting Magistrate may commit the offender to the Common Goal of the County of Victoria, at Lindsay, with or without hard labor, for any period not exceeding twenty-one days, unless the said penalty and costs be sooner paid.

Read a first and second time and passed in open Council this 10th day of April, A. D. 1911.
