GOOD ROADS AND LAND VALUES

Increase Estimated at Between Two and Nine Dollars an Acre

While it is impossible to assign an arbitrary per cent. or amount to represent the increase in land value by reason of road improvement it is safe to estimate that the increase per acre within the zone of influence of an improved road would be from \$2 to \$9 an acre. As there are about 850,000 acres of farm lands improved and unimproved in the United States, the possibilities of aggregate increase in value are enormous, says H. B. Harper of Detroit.

In the crop moving season the railroads that traverse the great agricultural sections are taxed far beyond their equipment. For many months, while the country roads are impassable, much of this equipment is idle, and thus the railroads suffer a double loss.
