HOW TO BLACKEN BROWN BOOTS

Take a piece of washing soda the size of a walnut and dissolve it in a cupful of boiling water. When cool rub boots well with it, and set them to dry. When dry give the boots a good coat of burnishing ink, to be obtained at the currier's or leather merchant (ordinary ink will not do). When this has dried in, clean them well with a good boot polish. They will then look as good as new.

CARE OF CARPETS

Instead of using tea leaves, which are apt to stain a carpet, try the following:—Steep a newspaper in lukewarm water, then squeeze out tear in small pieces, scatter over the carpet, and it can then bes wept in comfort, the damp paper collecting the dust and fluff in a surprising manner. Go over the carpet with a cloth wrung out of clean water, to which a tablespoonful of turpentine has been added, and the carpet will look fresh and new again.


