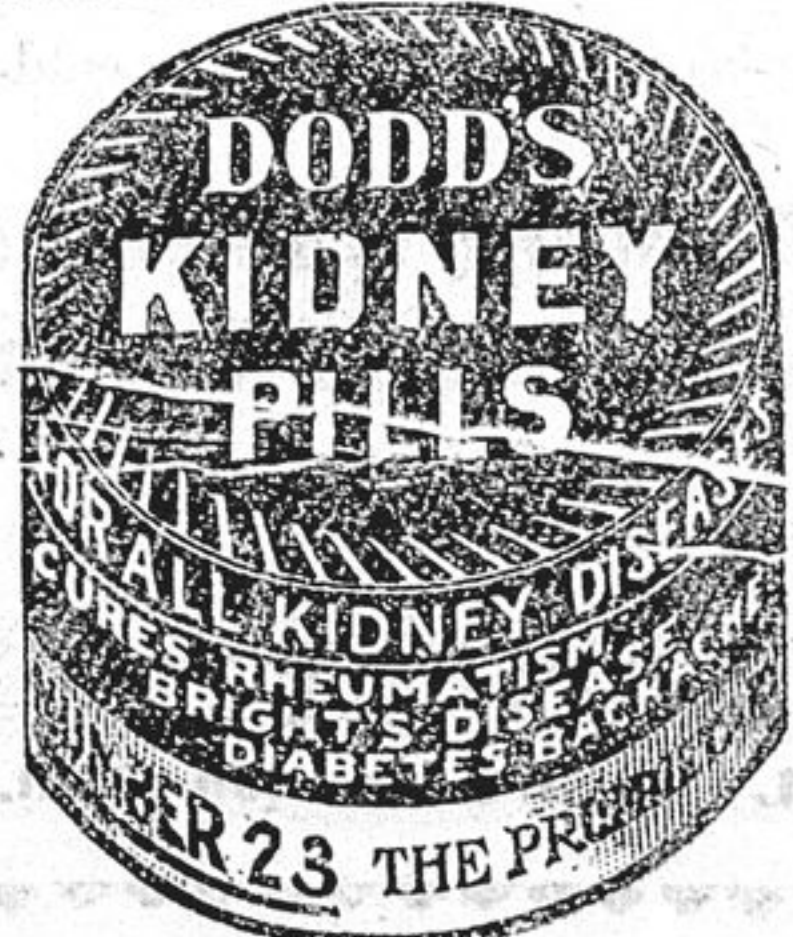

SCOTT'S "BLACK DWARF."

Character Was David Ritchie, Native of Tweeddale.

How many of Sir Walter Scott's readers believe that "Black Dwarf" is not altogether an imaginary character. Such is the case, however. The poor man's name was David Ritchie, a native of Tweeddale. He was the son of a laborer in the slate quarries of Stobo. Sometimes his mis-shapen form was imputed to ill-usage, and sometimes to having been born that way. He was taught the trade of a brush maker at Edinburgh; but his extreme ugliness of form and face caused such painful attention, that he wandered from place to place. Finally he settled himself on a bit of wild moorland on the farm of Woodhouse in the vale of the small river Manor in Peebleshire, where he built himself a little house. The late Sir James Nasmyth was proprietor of the ground. Poor David had built without leave; but Sir James allowed the encroachment. The dwarf hated children on account of their insults. He was 3½ feet high and was hideous to look at. Yet he was not destitute of intellectual true force and finer feeling.

He was a true lover of the beauties of nature. David never refused gratuities from strangers, and at his death in the beginning of last century he possessed \$100. His living favorites were a cat and dog, and he was very fond of his small garden and bees; of which he took great care. He first wished to be buried in the glen, where he had his little hermitage; but changed his mind, and was finally interred in the burial ground of Manor Parish.

He died some years before Scott sketched the character of "Elsie of the Mucklestane Moor" from David Ritchie.

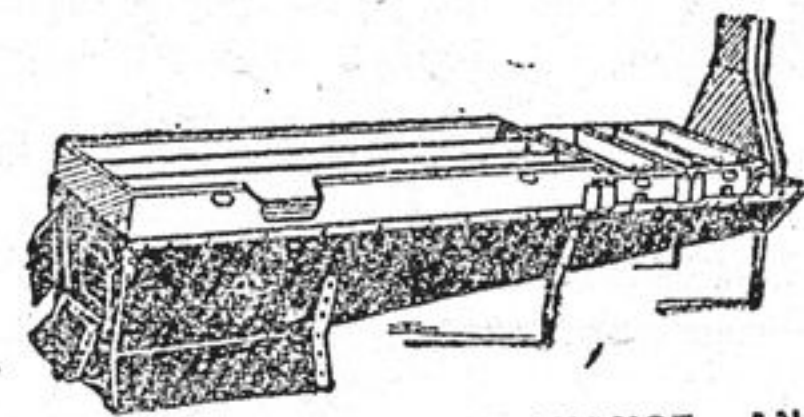
