XMAS STAMPS SELLING FAST

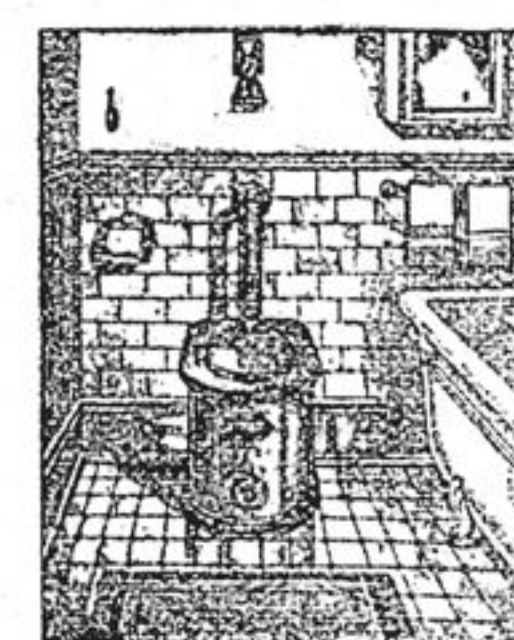
