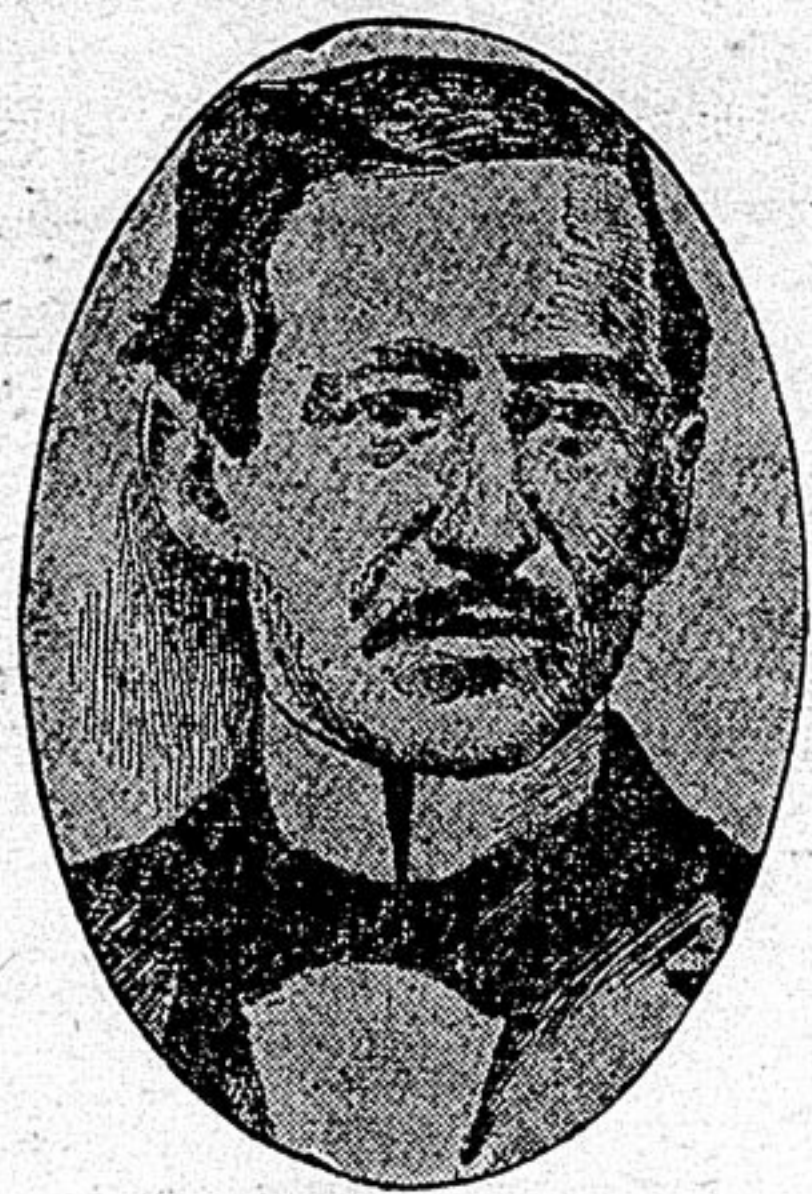

WHY CRUST IS BEST.

Eat the crust of bread in preference to the crumb. This is the advice of The Lancet, for a century or more a sort of doctors' Bible. This London medical publication says that analysis shows that the crumb contains on an average 43 per cent. of moisture, while the crust contains only 20 per cent. One important dietetic difference between crust and crumb is the fact that the former contains an increased amount of soluble carbohydrates owing to the action of intense heat which the crust receives compared with the crumb during baking. Moreover, the crust has a more pronounced bread flavor than the crumb, a flavor which is attractive and which stimulates the flow of digestive juices.

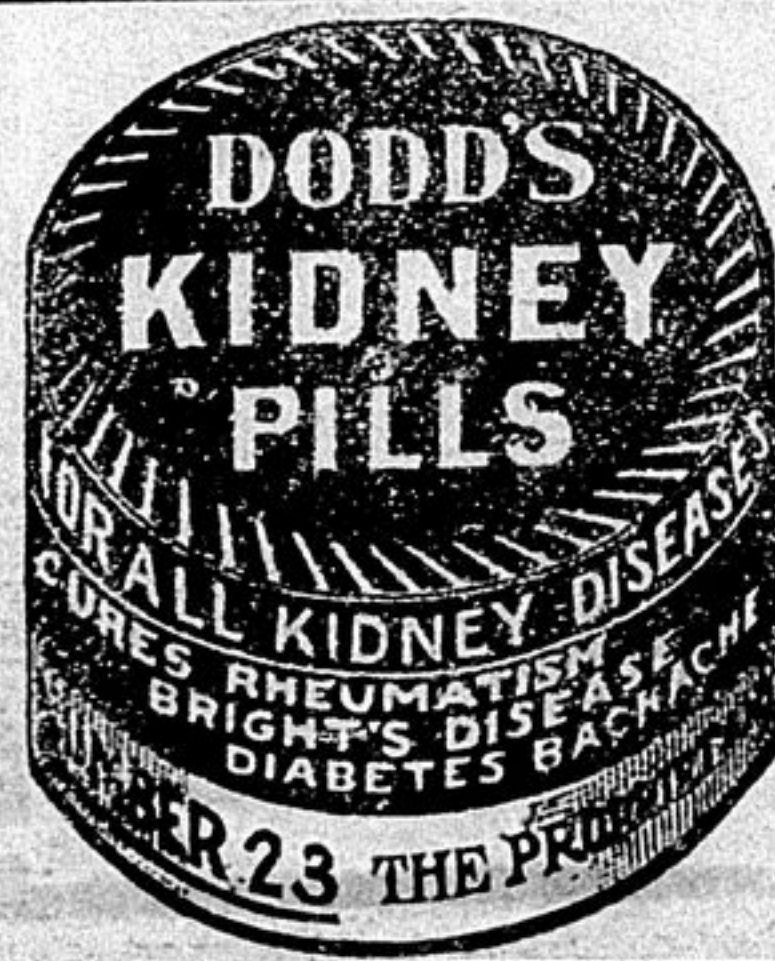
TWO TOGETHER.
