DISTRIBUTION OF BIBLES

Sixty-seven thousand Bibles were distributed during 1911 by the Upper Canada Bible Society. These figures far exceed those of any previous year. During 1910, 48,000 were distributed and that was a record year. In 1910, \$53,000 was collected from the eastern boundaries of Ontario west to the railroad to Toronto, Hudson Bay and coast. The net gain over the previous year was in the neighborhood of \$15,000, the balance having been collected in the eastern provinces.


