## REAL EQUALITY FOR WOMEN.

#### New Swedish Bill Gives Them Same Rights as Men.

The Suffrage Bill just introduced by the Government indicates that Sweden will be the first independent country to grant women the fullest electoral privileges. The bill provides that women shall have the vote on exactly the same condiions as men.

Many interesting features are involved. The bill allows a husband to cast his wife's vote, and an amendment is being prepared which gives wives of sailors, fishermen, soldiers, etc., who are absent on the day of election, the right to cast

their votes for them. Under the present Swedish law a man loses his vote if he is a bankrupt, or has not paid taxes for the last three years. Under the new bill if a woman is living with a bankrupt, a pauper or a non-taxpaying husband she loses her vote unless she has a separate marriage settlement. Otherwise she is to be treated exactly the same as a man, and she may be elected to either chamber of Parliament with the express condition that she may resign her seat whenever she pleases.


