Rural Delivery

Canadian people are catching on to the advantages of the system of rural mail delivery. Many applications are being received by the post office department, especially from Ontario. There are now 850 rural deliveries, 250 of them having been added in the past year. The greater number of applications come from Ontario where most of the routes are now located. Twenty-five thousand delivery boxes have been erected.

Antiquity of Shorthand

According to Professor C. M. Coburn, of Alleghany College, Meadville, Penn., an explorer of ancient ruins, who lectured in Cleveland, "The Sermon on the Mount," was taken down in shorthand. BY-LAW NO.**

A By-Law to close a portion of road and to provide for opening a road in lieu thereof.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Somerville enacts:

That that portion of the road commonly known as the Cameron Road, crossing Lot No. 87 in the Front Range of the Township of Somerville, be closed and abandoned. That this By-Law shall take effect so soon as and not until the Canada Lime Company shall have opened a road on the east and north sides of their property on the said Lot No. 87 in the Front Range in lieu of the said road closed hereby.

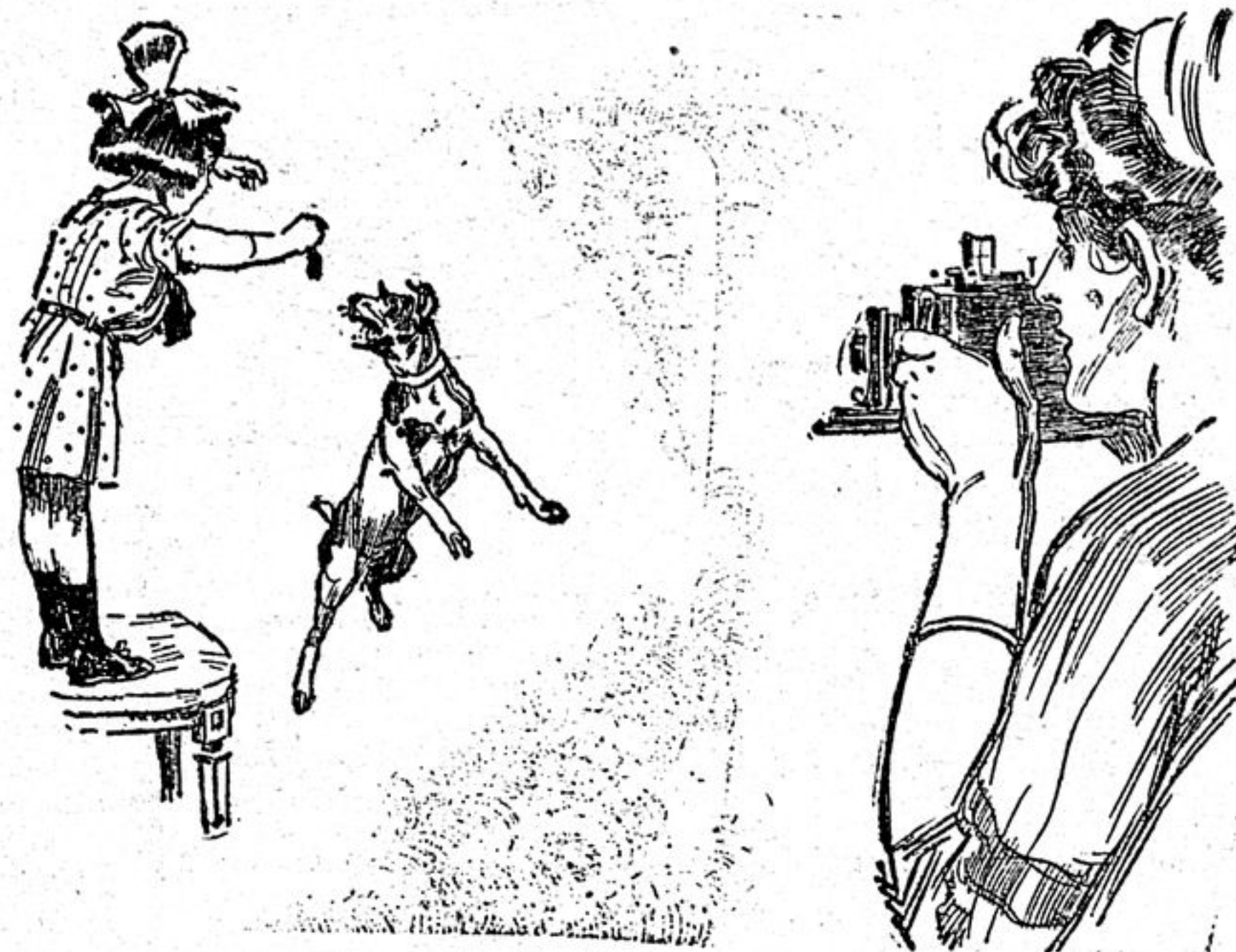
