

## POULTRY RULES

A great source of contagion is in the drinking troughs. Remember, if roup should make its appearance in your poultry house. In place of "tonics" drop a nail into the drinking trough and allow it to remain there. It will supply all the "tincture of iron" required. If you feed whole corn place it in the oven and parch it occasionally and feed smoking hot. The fowls appreciate it in frosty weather. A little linseed or oil meal given once a week in the soft feed will promote laying. This will not come under the heading of "dosing the fowls with medicine." Do not throw your table scraps in to the swill barrel, but give them to the chickens. One of the most important points in the keeping of ducks is to give them clean, dry quarters at night. They are very prone to leg weakness in cold, damp quarters. Feed your fowls just what they will eat up clean. Fat hens or pullets are not good layers. The latter is just what you want when the eggs are 28 cents or more per dozen. Fowls over three years old are not as a rule good breeders. The males are unable to properly fertilize the eggs for hatching while the stock is usually weak. Four years is generally a ripe old age for a fowl. Each hen if properly kept will lay from 200 to 250 eggs a year. Liver and intestines are an excellent food to make hens lay. Keep an abundant supply of lime where the hens can easily get it if you desire your hens to lay well. Always clean the nest well and put in fresh straw before the hens begin to sit.—H. J. K.

## RAILWAYS IN B. C.

Hundred Millions to be Spent in Next Few Years

Sir Richard McBride estimates the amount to be spent in railway construction in British Columbia during the next four years at \$100,000,000 and expresses the opinion that the expenditure will in all probability be over that amount. Mention of the figures brings one to a realization of what is being done and what is contemplated by the different railway companies that are anxious to do business on the Pacific seaboard. Activity is not confined to any one road, but to all of the four which already have lines in British Columbia, namely, the Canadian Pacific Railway, the Great Northern, the Canadian Northern and the Grand Trunk Pacific, and also the Pacific Great Eastern, which is reckoned practically as the Grand Trunk Pacific. Work has been begun on the large pier of the Canadian Pacific Railway which will cost three-quarters of a million dollars, and excavation is proceeding on the site of the new depot. The Canadian Pacific Railway will spend more in British Columbia during the next few years than for many years past. The Great Northern will double track its lines between Vancouver and New Westminster.

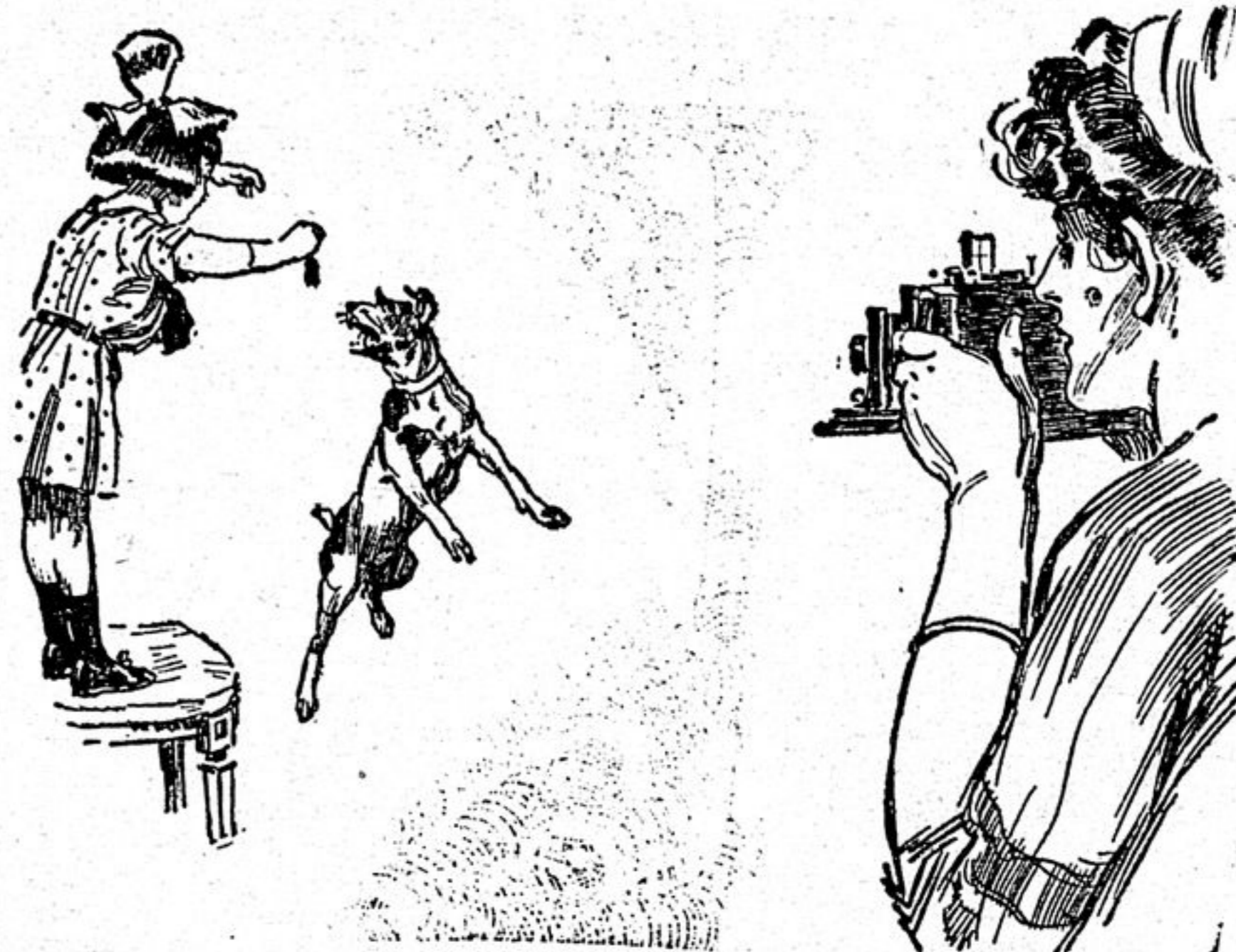

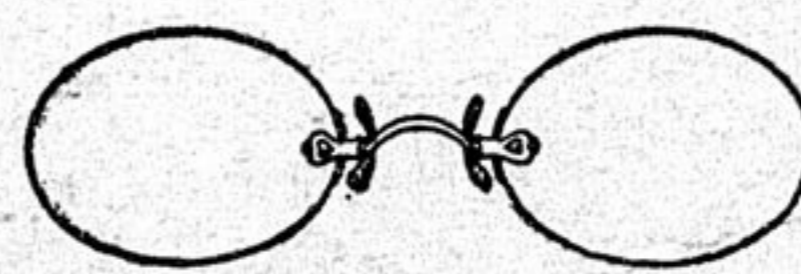
