## BISHOP FOR FIFTY YEARS

"Oldest Catholic Missionary Lives in Far North

The celebration at Grouard, at the western end of Lesser Slave Lake, of the fiftieth anniversary of Bishop Grouard-the oldest active Roman Catholic misionary in Canada-will be remembered as one of the most unusual and picturesque events in the entire life of the north.

Long before the date for the opening ceremonies Indians began arriving with their squaws and papooses from every point of the compass, and by the most primitive means of transportation, to do honor to the occasion. This great band of aborigines-of which there were at least a thousand -were dressed in their gaudiest costumes, and the riot of color was very magnificent.

The Indians encamped all along the northwest shore of the lake, and the · trails of blue smoke arising out of the crests of the creamy white tepees made wavy lines against the green of the foliage and the deeper blue of the sky.

The ceremony began with a recep tion and was followed by mass and various sports.
