Marmaduke Terrill Killed at Trenton

Late on Friday afternoon the mangled remains of Marmaduke Terrill, a prominent citizen of Trenton, were discovered beside the Central Ontario roundhouse. He left his home on Thursday evening to go to the Grand Trunk station to meet a wedding party due to arrive on the Belleville local at 8.48. No one saw the accident happen, but it is supposed that he was struck by a passing U. T. R. freight, and thrown down the embankment, which is about thirty feet high at this point. He was a widower, about sixty years of age, and a partner in the undertaking firm of McNair & Terrill. Rev. A. J. Terrill of Tweed, is the only son.

Deceased was a cousin of Mr. S. N. Terrill, Fenelon Falls.

During the seven months ending with July, 1911, \$7,500,000 worth of flax grown in the western provinces were exported to the United States. That flax paid 25c. per bushel or one million dollars in duty on entering the United States. None of this tax would have been paid had the Reciprocity agreement of 1911 been accepted. And still alleged statesmen have the hardihood to tell us Reciprocity would be no benefit. In seven months ending with July, the United States imported 1,780,000 cattle from Mexico. If Canada had accepted the reciprocity agreement Canadian cattle would now be entering the United States market free of duty, while Mexican cattle would be taxed.

Every financial corporation and every manufacturer laughed at the farmer, and they defeated the efforts for relief, and a large number of farmers voted with the financial corporations. If a Canadian Conservative buys an automobile in the United States that is alright, but if a Liberal in Canada wants to sell his farm produce across the line he is disloyal and he is tramping on the old flag.

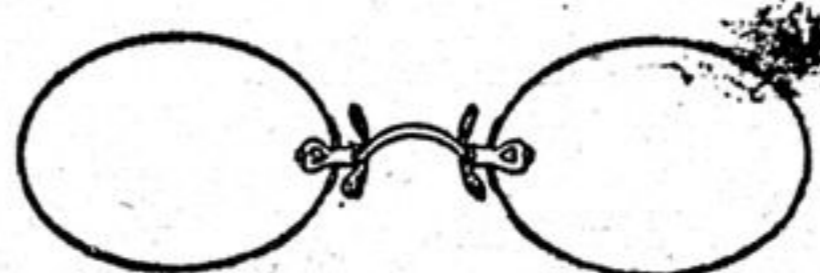
