To the Editor of the Gazette:

Dear Sir .-Ever since the Curlers' entertain ment a few days ago, there is a question in my mind which I have been trying to answer, namely, "What is the matter with the people of Fenelon Falls, the good loyal citizens of Fenelon Falls?"

I refer to the manner in which we sang, or rather did not sing our National Anthem on that occasion. The signal for leaving the hall, or putting on our coats, is not, as so many of us seem to think, when the performers leave the stage, but after we, the audience, have sung the National An-

I know it is late, and we are in a hurry to go home, but do you know how long it takes to sing the National Anthem? If you take out your watch, and time yourself you will find, unless you actually go to sleep, that it won't take you one minute. A trifle over half a minute is good enthusiastic time.
