WOMEN IN THE WAR.

Two Heroines, Miss Alt and Mme. Schneider, Care for Wounded.

One bright feature of the Balkan war stands out, the heroic and, better still, the efficient work of a self-sacrificing little band of men and women who are devoting their lives to the alleviation of suffering, writes a Constantinople correspondent.

Their names, which deserve to be written in letters of gold, are as follows: Miss Alt, Mme. Schneider, the Rev. Robert Frew, the Hon. Maurice Baring, Mr. Hoffman Philip and Major E. S. Ford.

Miss Alt is a frail, aged Swiss lady, with snow-white hair, and Mme. Schneider is a little Hungarian woman of about 60. Mr. Baring is the well-known writer, journalist and playwright; Mr. Frew, the pastor of the Scottish church; Mr. Philip is first secretary to the American Embassy, who volunteered for the noble work because he could not induce the red Crescent representatives to undertake the task; Major Ford was in charge of a ward for wounded, but gave up that work for the far more arduous and perilous work of tending the cholera patients.

Of Miss Alt, what can one say to do justice to her? Picture a grand, white-haired old lady, with bent back, going to and fro amid the stricken soldiers, handling them in their filthy, uncared for condition, feeding them, giving them medicine and doing everything in her power to increase their comfort on the cold, hard ground.

Picture beside her a cheerful-faced little grey-haired lady, Mme. Schneider, going about with a heavy pail of hot soup.

Before these Europeans, and these two heroic women were the first, took over command of the camp, uninvited, the conditions were unspeakably worse even than they are to-day. The dead were left on the ground, untouched, untended, unmoved. There was filth everywhere.

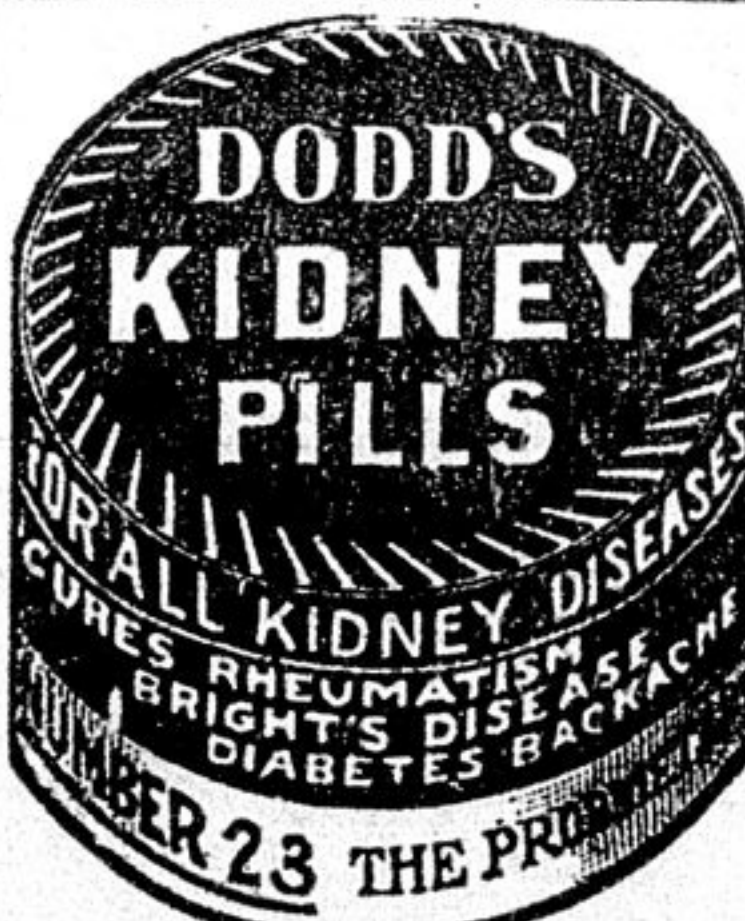

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NORWEGIAN POLICEMEN.

Special Duty of the Chief Policewoman.

The appointment of another policewoman at Christiania now brings the feminine police force in Norway up to seven, three of whom are in Christiania, two at Bergen, one in Stavanger, and one in Christiansand, says the London Standard.

The special duty of the chief policewoman in Christiania, Sergeant Osen, is to keep under surveillance girls and women suspected of living immoral lives, and female beggars, while her two colleagues interrogate women tramps, and, if deserving, render them help, look after the children and see that they are kept off the streets as vendors and beggars.

The policewomen all perform occasional night duty and patrol some of the worst quarters of the city. With the exception of the policewomen at Christiansand, who wear a complete official uniform, the women are dressed in plain clothes, only wearing green capes bearing a small medallion stamped with the crown and lion of Norway, to distinguish them from ordinary citizens.

Unique Birth Register.

In Holland births, marriages and deaths, instead of being recorded in newspapers, are indicated by windmills. When a miller gets married he stops his mill with the arms of the wheel in a slanting position and with the sails unfurled. His friends and guests frequently do likewise with their mills, in token of the ceremony. To indicate a birth the wheel is stopped with the arms in a slanting position, but at a more acute angle than for a marriage and with the two upper sails unfurled. Should a miller die the sails of his mill are all furled and the wheel is turned round until the arms form an upright cross, in which position they are left until after the funeral has taken place.

Decrease in London Crime.

In his charge to the Grand Jury at the London Sessions, Mr. Robert Wallace, K.C., said that last session the calendar was the lightest that had ever been known in the history of the session, and he was happy to say that the list of charges at that session was very much of the same nature. There had been steady diminution in the list of charges, particularly during the year 1912. As compared with some five years ago, there was practically a diminution of some 25 per cent. in the number of offences indictable and tried at the sessions.
