## AMBASSADOR'S PRIVILEGES.

Only Person That Can Turn Back on a King.

Ambassadors to foreign courts are hedged with formalities, but they also enjoy numerous privileges unbeknown to the average layman. Ambassadors and their households are safe from arrest. The embassy is considered a geographical part of the Ambassador's own country.

The Ambassador is the only person about court who has the right to turn his back upon a sovereign when concluding an interview. He turns and bows after walking three paces, a prerogative he always exercises. This refers, however, only to state occasions. A peculiar situation arose from his privilege in Queen Victoria's time. Of course, it was considered rude to turn one's back to a woman, therefore an Ambassador never did. He merely edged his way, sideways, to the door.

Ambassadors are accorded the privilege of entering the presence of a sovereign through wide-open doors. Lesser dignitaries and court attaches enter through one leaf of a folding door. An Ambassador can demand and get an interview with a ruler at any time, a privilege many sovereigns, doubt, abhor.

The sword is the Ambassador's emblem of honor. It is a long, blunt-pointed rapier, and the late Lord Dufferin declared the only practical use he ever found for it was to stir fires and file bills on.


