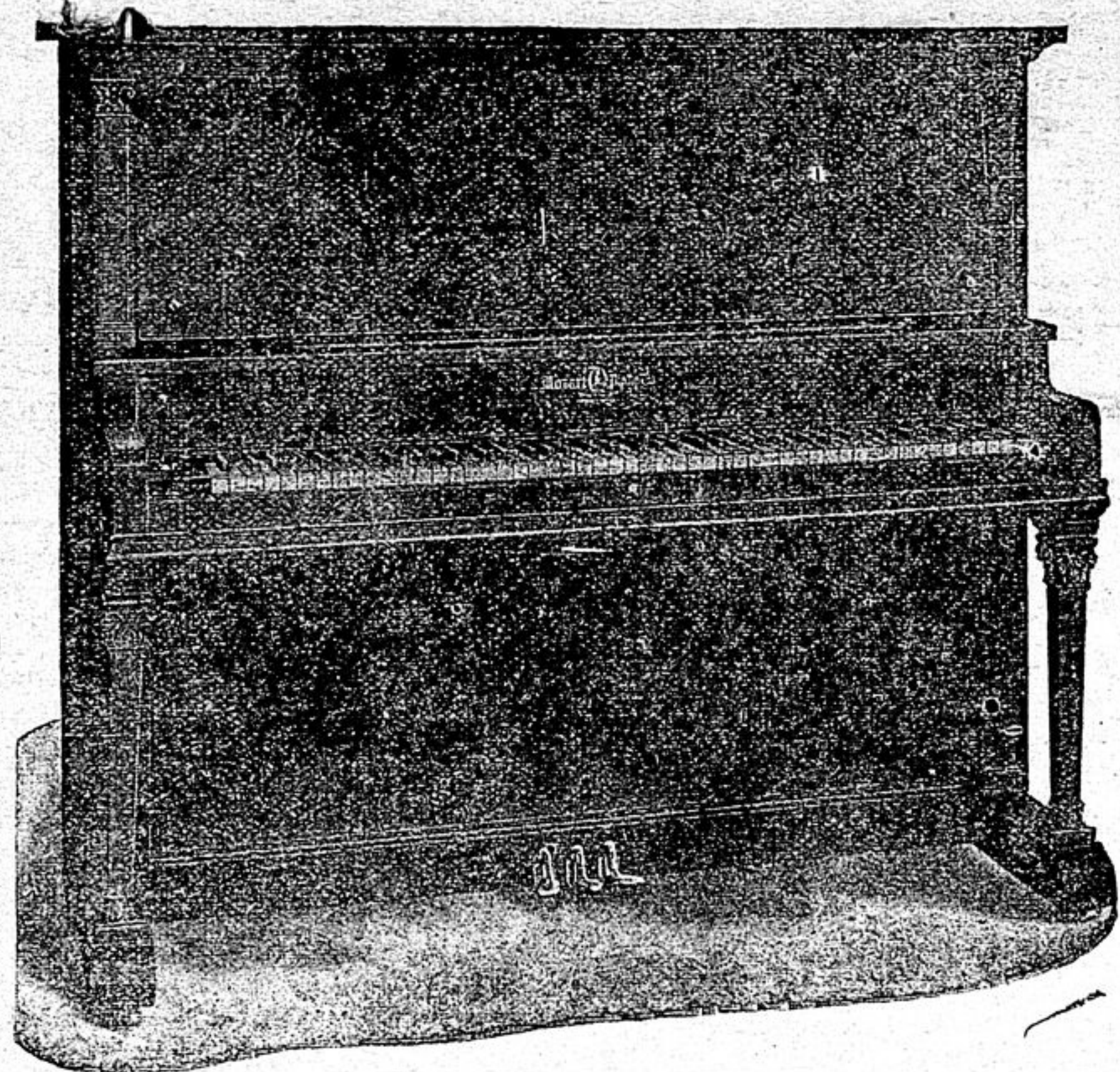

**Women's institute.**

After opening exercises the minutes of last meeting were read and adopted. Mrs. Geo. Rutherford and Mrs. Thos. Poulson were appointed a visiting committee. A resolution was carried that the Institute hold an entertainment early in the coming year. A discussion followed on Christmas giving and kindred topics, including Santa Claus. The members were pleased to welcome Mrs. Perrin, president of the Cameron branch, as a visitor. A report of the Institute Convention held in Toronto on Nov. 20th and 21st was given by the secretary. The meeting closed with the singing of the national anthem, after which refreshments were served by the hostess.

**Fenelon Council.**

Council met at Cameron on Dec. 15th as per statute. The minutes of the last meeting were confirmed. The following motions passed:—  
Lee—Mark:—That a by-law be introduced providing for the holding of the annual elections. The by-law was passed, signed and sealed, Mr. Mark in the chair.  
Mark—Lee:—That a grant of \$25 be made to Fenelon Agricultural Society.  
Mark—Smithson:—That S. McLean be paid \$13.20 bonus on wire fence on McKinnon's hill.  
Moynes—Smithson:—That the following persons be refunded error in dog tax: D. Spence \$2, Geo. Robertson \$2, Mrs. J. Blatchford \$1, Wm. Cook \$1.  
Mark—Lee:—That Cameron Telephone Co. receive permission to place their poles on the roadside leading to Cameron, also a line leading from Cameron to Cambray; said poles to be placed according to the Ontario statutes regarding obstructions to highways.  
Smithson—Moynes:—That the following bills be paid:—  
Bonus for wire fences \$422 00; 338 loads of gravel \$33 80; councillors, commission on road expenditure \$47 77; W. J. Goodham, erecting Mrs. W. Switzer's wire fence, \$19 45; W. Thornbury taking J. Docharly to hospital, \$4 50; W. H. Powles, for postage & stationery, \$2 50; Gazette, for printing election notices, \$3; expense roads & bridges, \$87 02; Clerk, on salary, \$45; Treasurer on salary, \$50; Collector, on salary, \$60; J. H. Brandon, balance on cement \$16 65; National Cement Co. for tile, \$31 50; Wm. Chambers, for one sheep killed by dogs, \$8; Geo. Bagshaw, inspecting sheep, 75c.  
Mr. J. Moore asked the council for \$25 damage to his buggy caused by upset at J. Westaway's gate. Council laid it over for further consideration.

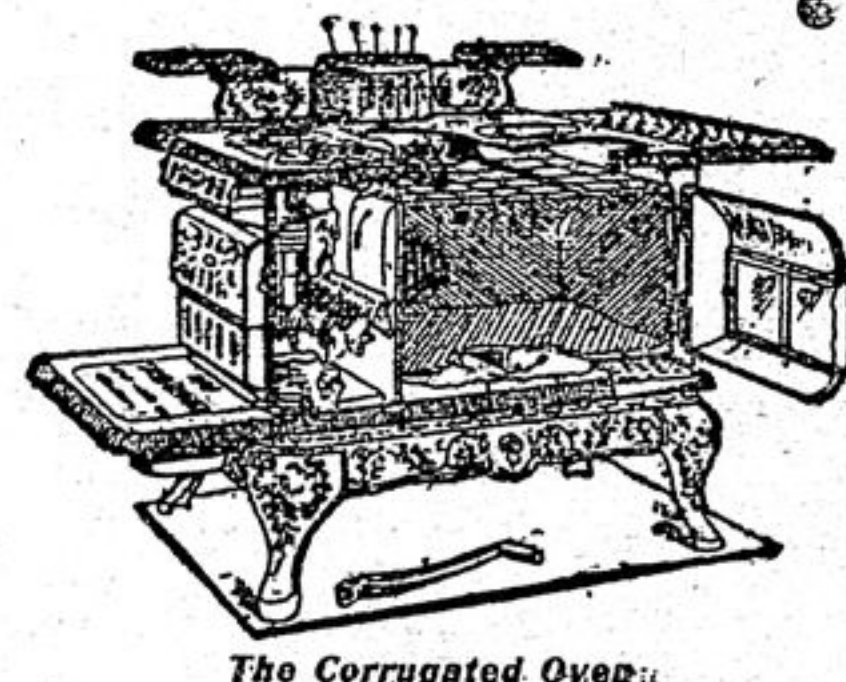
