A Useful Magnetic Tool

Owners of automobiles who have dropped nuts, bolts or tools into oil-filled gear cases and then tried to fish them out will appreciate the value of a little electro-magnet tool. It will operate from either dry cells or storage batteries.

When the thumb is pressed upon a little button, the tool becomes magnetized and will lift from three to five pounds, according to the strength of the current. It is handy also for removing valves from the cylinder, finding nails in tires or removing chips from the oil in a crank case without removing the oil.

The device is also designed for use in the machine trade for removing borings from holes to be tapped. A thread on the end of the rod permits the attachment of an extension to reach where the tool itself is not built to reach.

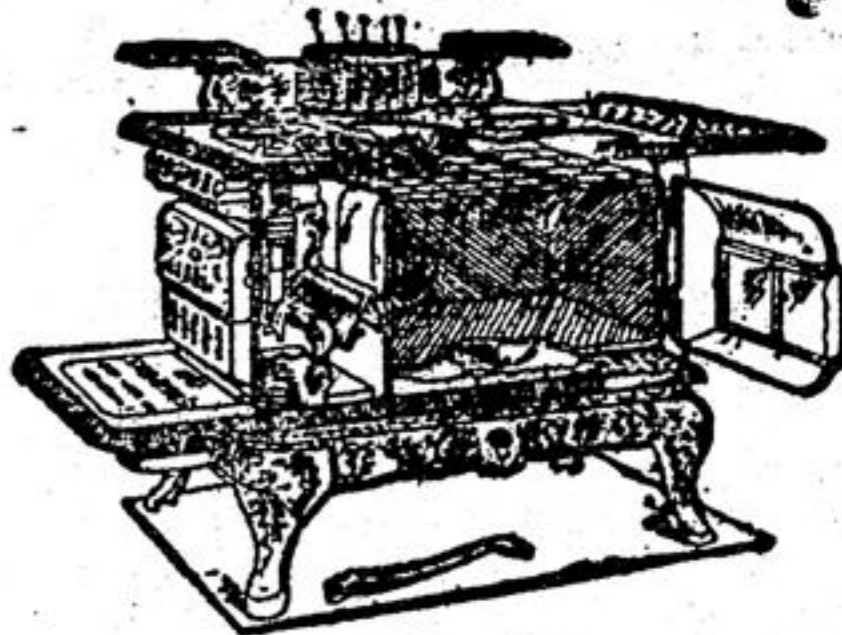
