SHOULD PROTECT THE FUR ANIMALS

Pirates in Northern Ontario Fastnesses Said to be Waging a War of Extermination

While beaver and other fur-bearing animals are increasing at such a rate in Algonquin Park that it has been found necessary to thin them out, trappers and hunters are waging a war of extermination on these valuable animals beyond the limits of the park. This northland is such a network of waterways and forest fastnesses that it forms an ideal breeding ground for all the well known furbearers. Beaver, otter, fisher, marten, mink, muskrat and lynx thrive here to perfection and produce fur not to be equalled, much less excelled, anywhere else on the continent. Before the days of steel traps and white trappers, with their chemically-prepared baits, the Indians were assured of a good catch even with their primitive dead-falls and snares. But those days have passed never to return, unless the whole country is protected in like manner to Algonquin Park, and that, of course, is impossible. The rapid rise in the price of all kinds of fur has greatly increased the number of trappers. These men usually select their hunting grounds early in the fall, build one or more camps, according to the number of traps they intend to employ, and bring in their supplies by canoe. Far beyond the last outpost of civilization they pitch their camps, and when every lake and stream is locked in the icy fetters of winter, ply their trade without let or hindrance. While mink, marten and some other furs may be taken during certain months, the taking of beaver and otter is strictly prohibited. But the big prices to be obtained for these is a standing inducement to many to violate the law. Particularly is this the case near the Quebec boundary, as in that Province beaver and otter may be sold provided the trapper is prepared to swear they were taken in Quebec. Such a trifling matter as perjury is of no consequence to these pelt pirates, who take the oath and sell their furs in this way whenever their catch warrants a trip across the boundary. To follow these men to their forest fastnesses is almost impossible in winter, although the officers of the Game and Fisheries Department may know very well the districts they are working in. But although they may be reached occasionally it is quite another matter to secure evidence sufficient to convict

them, and the best that can be done




