### Workers Must Be Temperate.

No man is at his best when he is drinking, and the situation is such now that the workers need their best faculties to meet it. It may do for an arrogant master class to souse itself until it has not the brains to comprehend the meaning of the social unrest that is world-wide, but workers must keep their heads; and they can use their money better than for booze. In Germany the Socialists are urging the workers to give up their schnapps. All over the world the same cry is being taken up by Socialists. It is having its effect. It is likely that the strongest force in the world for temperance will soon be the Socialist party, just as it is now the strongest force for peace. But the new crusade is along practical lines. We are working for the emancipation of the toilers, for the highest freedom the world has known, and while there is not a bit of the moralist and the puritan about us, still the issue is so grave that we need and have a right to demand the very best there is in every worker. Cut out the booze.—Appeal.

### A Judge on Socialism,

Horace E. Deemer, Justice of the Supreme Court of Iowa, in a recent speech at Omaha said: Socialism has been misconceived, misconstrued, misrepresented, mocked and derided for years, but it still continues to grow. Socialists cast over 10,000,000 votes in the civilized world, and in Germany have eighty members holding the balance of power in the reichstag. In France and Switzerland they have likewise wielding power, and have control of many cities in the United States.

Figures based on votes cast do not represent the full strength of the movement, for hundreds of thousands of Socialists do not vote the Socialist ticket at elections.

The army of the unemployed is constantly recruited while the products of the country continue to increase. People go barefoot while there is an over-production of shoes, and others go homeless while there is an over-production of building material. Attacked by this over-production, or, rather, this under-consumption, the capitalists seek other markets in foreign countries. Thus the national interests clash, and the conflict of commercial interests is the modern cause of war and costly armaments.

Ultimately, in some way, either our whole civilization must be wrecked or else it must develop a new form of industrial organization that will supplant the capitalistic system.

Every bond and every certificate of stock, Mr. Workingman, is a mortgage on your labor.

### The Masters See.

Poverty is not the fault of providence, which provides in abundance. There are millions of men, women, and children in this, the richest country in the world, who through no fault of their own, go through life sodden in poverty, wretchedness, and despair.

You cannot deal with a problem of this magnitude by mere spasmodic appeals to the charity of the benevolent. That is hopelessly inadequate. You might as well try to run the army and navy by voluntary subscriptions. It is the community alone that can command the resources to drain this morass of wretchedness, so as to convert it into a verdant and fertile plain.

I don't agree with the view that the church is concerned solely with spiritual things. Those who take that view reflect on the career of the Master.—Lloyd George, Chancellor of England, on New Year day, 1912.

### Not a Remedy.

Reform is not a remedy. Capitalism can offer no remedy for the evils from which you suffer and would offer none if it could.

In England they would procure some of the land now in possession of landlords and put the workers on it. But they would buy it of the landlords, which would change the tribute from rent to interest but not end the tribute.

In America they would give us government ownership of railroads. But this would involve a tremendous indebtedness, and would only change the tribute from dividends to interest, without ending the tribute.

They will let the government of the United States issue money now and guarantee it. But the banks will distribute the money, so the control of the currency is not changed in the least.

All these things are merely fakes put up to fool you. They are playing you for suckers, as they have always done. And you will always be suckers if you continue to fall for them.—Appeal.

Why doesn't somebody get up a corner in postage stamps? There ought to be lot of money in it.

In one way the interests of the employer and employe are identical—they both want all they can get.

A favorite maxim of the masters of the jobs is "Time is money." He gets the money and you get the time.

The capitalists own the jobs, but the workers own the votes. It is a snap for the workers when they get wise to it.
