## Bancroft Swept by Fire.

BANCROFT, Ont, July 26.-A destructive fire, fanned by a strong wind, played havoc with the business section of Bancroft tonight. Nine buildings, including the botel and postoffice, were destroyed, and a loss of about \$75,000 was entailed.

The buildings and stores destroyed by the fire are as follows: Bancroft Hotel, Benjamin's dry goods store, Reid & Thompson's general store, Willing's bakery; Walter VanDer Vort, barber, Sair & Mullet, hardware; Thos. French, grocery; and the postoffice. All the structures, with the exception of the hotel, which was built of brick, were built entirely of wood.

Shortly after six o'clock the fire broke out in Willing's bakery. Before the volunteer fire brigade could be brought to the scene the bakery was demolished and the fiames were spreading down Bridge street. Soon the whole of the in-habitants of the district were fighting the flames, but with little success. Salvage operations were commenced, and much property was saved.

The guests at the hotel had a narrow escape, a number of them being at dinner when the fire broke out.

The fire was under control in two hours.

## Colonel Sam Afraid of Trouble

Ottawa, July 23-It is understood that in view of the gravity of the situation at present existing in British politics, and of the critical position in which the British army may be placed by an outbreak or rising in Ireland, that Colonel the Hon.
