AGRICULTURAL TOPICS. Prof. Robertson Speaks. Dairy Commissioner, is again in Ottawa speaking of his trip he says: "I found Canadian cheese, butter and eggs growing in favor of importers and wholesale houses. I discovered that we are suffering from unfairness of treatment by the re-puting our best products by putting our customers as consumers of their consuming customers as English. Our Canadian producer not get the extra price which is given by the British consumers by reason of this deception. Not more than a third of the ten millions of dollars worth of our cheese are ultimately consumed in Canada. Almost no but goes to selling Canadian beef. 'Canadian and American beef' is sold only in the rough shops, where the cuts are cheap." Of course, the Canadian and English farmers, observed a great and growing demand for fresh-made fine butter; the worst classes (the multitudinous class of inferior products) are well consumed at average, ordinary price of common shares.
