the certainty of my own imperfect existence is necessary, so also the conception of the perfect. This conception is necessary and inseparable from the thought most entirely our own, but from this we are by no means entitled to infer the existence of God.

On the contrary there arises a series of doubts on this inference. If the perfect is the aim of our endeavors, it is nothing else than an idea in us. When we become conscious of our powers, we are also conscious of our defects and limitations; and while in thought we increase our powers, and disregard their limitations, we come to the conception of a most perfect being.

We are led to ask—How does the idea of the imperfect arise? How do we obtain the knowledge of our own imperfection? It is one thing to be imperfect, yet quite another to know that we are so.

Now we have a changed order of things—what seemed to be the inference is in truth the ground. From the idea of the perfect arises that of the imperfect. In our certainty of God our certainty of self has its origin.

Having thus become acquainted with the true nature of Descartes' proof of existence of God, and the true connexion of its various parts, we cannot but perceive that the statements concerning the idea, reality and truthfulness of God are not the most edifying assurances, but principles, which constitute the foundation of Knowledge and support the remainder of the philosophic system.

DOES A HAND SEPARATOR PAY?

A QUESTION OF MUCH INTEREST TO FARMERS.
Many farmers in this neighbourhood are thinking of putting in hand separators. A number have already been installed, and are giving satisfactory results.

This is a question which thousands of progressive dairymen are asking themselves to-day, and judging from the number of farm dairy machines now being sold, hundreds of the most practical men are answering in the affirmative.

Indeed the average dairyman with an average herd must look to this as the source from which the net profits must come. The reports and bulletins of the agricultural experiment stations both in the United States and in Europe show clearly that the most profitable use to make of skim milk is in feeding to young and growing animals, such as calves, pigs

and poultry. The next best is for feeding animals making rapid growth which need food of a fat-producing kind in connection with milk, and that skim milk, except for very young animals, gives a much better result when used in combination with other materials, generally ground grain, than when fed alone.
