## Somerville Court of Revision and Council Proceedings

Council met at Burnt River on May 27th, for court of revision pursuant to notice presented Messrs. Stewart, Callan and Burtchall. The members having taken the prescribed oath, Mr. Griffin was elected chairman, and the following appeals were disposed of: F. G. Evans, appellant \$25, reduction on assessment confirmed; Chas. Poole, appellant, assessment reduced to \$100. Moved by Mr. Callan, seconded by Mr. Burtchall, that Dr. E. A. White be assessed for \$100 personal property; that John Peio, sr., be assessed for south half lot 8, in the 8th con. instead of W. H. English; that C. W. Switzer's name be erased; and that Thomas Watson be assessed as freeholder for 13 and 18 Queen st., Cobcook; that George Lake be entered as holder for lot E. N. Cameron-st., Cobcook; that Charles Callan be entered on roll for M. F.; that H. Rushworth be assessed as tenant for north half 5, con. 12, and east half 5, con 13; and that Thomas Boynton be entered for M. F. lot No. 5, west Dixon, Cobcook, and lot No. 2, west st., Kinmount; and—Carried.

The court of revision was adjourned till the 6th of June, and the members went into council, Mr. Griffin in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. The clerk was authorized to arrange for the removal of J. Peio from the hospital. Also to prepare a by-law for the assumption by the municipality of the Burnt River cemetery. Accounts amounting to \$31 were passed and ordered to be paid. Moved by Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Callan, that the clerk be provided with ten dollars to meet possible expenses re Peio, any not expended to be returned.—Carried. The council adjourned till the 6th of June to meet at Burnt River.

## Burnt River, June 6th, 1899.

D. Graham instead of W. H. English; that Robert Mason be entered as M. F. lot No. 10, F. R., and that the roll as revised be the assessment roll for 1899.—Carried.

The court of revision adjourned and the members went into council, the reeve in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. Moved by Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Burtchall, that the reeve get a scraper for Mr. Goldie's division.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Burtchall, that J. Akister be given a contract of drawing cedar to cover the bridge on the 9th con. line, lot 13, at 4 cents per piece, and that he put a railing on the bridge and get the reeve to pay a reasonable sum for so doing.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Burtchall, that the reeve examine the road on the 3rd line near Mr. H. Coulter's, and report at the next meeting of the council as to what is required in the way of repair.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Burtchall, seconded by Mr. Griffin, that the clerk arrange for the admission of J. Peio into the House of Providence, Toronto, to pay \$75 per year in quarterly payments. Also that he year in and with the said institution with a view to getting W. Badgerow there.—Carried.

## They Ought to be Clean.

In his report of recent date regarding Canadian dairy produce in England Lord Strathcona, Canadian High Commissioner in London, says of the butter packages: Apparently greater progress has been made in the exportation of butter than in any other branch of the Canadian export trade. The difference between the price paid for Canadian butter and that paid for the best commodity in the market is gradually being reduced, but until this is done the efforts to improve trade conditions should not be allowed to slacken. The High Commissioner and all the Canadian commercial agents give considerable prominence in their recent reports to this branch of trade, Lord Strathcona says: "The 50th boxes seem to be in favor, but complaint is made of the dirty state in which the boxes arrive. The Australian boxes arrive clean and bright, fit to be placed immediately in a shop window. This defect, of course, can be avoided by washing, but the addition to the price is resented. The attention of the steamship companies ought to be called to the matter, as the appearances of the packages in which the butter arrives must necessarily have a considerable influence on its sale, both in the case of whole sales and retailers. There is no doubt that Canadian butter is now running the Australian product very close, but it should be shipped as soon as made, and not kept in cold storage. The quality must be maintained at a high and regular level, and supplies must be regular. What is wanted is for the creameries to have recognized brands, which will become known here."
