Paris, July 11 .- Ravachol, the Anarchist, murderer and thief, was executed this morning. He was awakened a 4.30 o'clock by the goal officals at Mount Brisson and informed that the day of his execution had arrived. The condemned man assumed an air of cynical indifference and when the ministrations of the prison chaplin were offered to him he refused to accept them, and broke out into strong invectives against religion.
