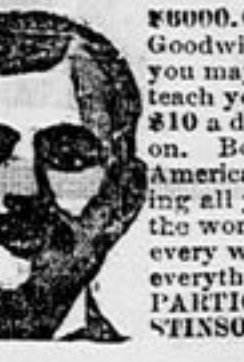
"I trust, sir," said I, addressing him, "that this will be a warning to you against the idle vantiy which caused you to diverge so mischievously from the truth last night."
